





LOGOS (SCRIPTURE)

In the Greek, the word Logos is used to refer to Scripture, particularly as proclaimed in gospel preaching & teaching. This can happen in various settings throughout a church family, but it always involves clarifying the person and work of Jesus, His Kingdom and our response to the call of the gospel.

Therefore, we strive to be a church continually submitting to the authority of God as we remain rooted in the Scriptures at every level of church life.



ETHOS (COMMUNITY)

In the Greek, the word Ethos literally means "character". It is used to describe the characteristics or guiding beliefs of a person, group, or institution. In its simplest form Ethos can be thought of as culture and community (a feel or a vibe).

We believe this is best cultivated through hospitality, friendship, caring for one another and Rocking Philipians 2 (Philippians 2.1-11).



PATHOS (EXPERIENCE)

In the Greek, the word Pathos has overtones of experience, emotion and suffering. For our purposes we are focusing on the concept of a tangible, experiential ministry of the Holy Spirit rooted in prayer and worship. We strive to be a people who are open to the experience of a transcendent AND immanent God who ministers to us through His Holy Spirit and through the body as we seek to edify and build up the body of Christ through the gifts the Holy Spirit gives to the followers of Jesus.



APOSTOLOS (MISSION)

In the Greek, the word Apostles means "sent one". The focus here is that of mission. Our mission at Aletheia Church is Disciple-Making as defined by Jesus in Matthew 28.16-20. This includes:

- Evangelism
- Gospel centered discipleship rooted in community
- Mercy and Justice initiatives
- Church planting & foreign missions
- Community engagement
