FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

GET WITHIN 6 FEET OF A TYCHICUS!

Tychicus, a traveling companion with the Apostle Paul, was an encourager. He was relied on to encourage the hearts of people in the churches. Check out Colossians 2:1-3, Ephesians 6:21-22 and Colossians 4:7-8.

We all have read about or experienced some of the impact distancing and isolation have on our mental and emotional health. We know that distancing can add to the stress of the pandemic in various ways...from being harsh to wanting to eat too much! It is easier to grow weary, distracted and make excuses these days. We need encouragement and encouragers.

Encouragement is an ongoing, regular, healthy and necessary component of our living the life of faith. Our hearts are like batteries that can be highly energized and productive but can only remain so if regularly and often recharged. The scriptures encourage us, the Holy Spirit encourages us and prayer encourages us...but the truth is that we encourage each other in incredibly effective ways.

Here are 3 questions that you can use when you reach out to someone that may help you genuinely encourage them:

- 1. Are you encouraged today? Any answer lets you ask "Why's that?" and may lead to sharing at a deeper heart level.**
- 2. What have you read or heard from the Bible lately that is worth sharing? If met with awkward silence or extended clearing of the throat, be prepared to politely answer the question from your own experience. They will listen and be encouraged.**
- 3. Do you mind if I pray with you? Wait for a response or not, but ask "What can I pray with you about?" or "If you could get God to do one thing, what would it be?."**

Learn to pronounce Tychicus, read about him in the Bible and then ask God to help you be an encourager like him!
