Not a Fan: Becoming a Completely Committed Follower of Jesus by Kyle Idleman



STOP! This is not a light, easy to skim through book. It could turn your world upside down. Kyle Idleman cuts hard and quick at the idea of merely accepting Jesus' invitation for eternal life without actually making an effort to follow Him. His premise that many who call themselves Christians (followers of Christ) are just fans not true followers is based on the passage in Matthew 7 in which Jesus says

many will one day hear "Depart from me, I never knew you." The reader is challenged on what a fan of Jesus looks like and how this is different from a follower. He says, a fan "wants to be close enough to Jesus to have eternal life, but not so close that it requires personal sacrifice. "A follower makes a decision every day to deny himself and choose Jesus...even if it costs everything." The last two sections of the book invite and challenge the reader to understand and commit to living Luke 9:23, *"If anyone would come after Me, he must deny himself and take up his cross daily and follow Me."*

Jesus calls anyone to follow Him and is clear on exactly what we are agreeing to when we decide to follow.

Reading Not a Fan will really challenge you to evaluate your standing before God. So many think they are Christ-followers but may not have realized "what they signed up for", and as a result are not truly followers. I love how so much of the book was NOT his opinion but Kyle's dissecting Jesus' invitation to follow Him. The author helps us see where we stand in relation to Jesus' invitation and what we need to do to be genuine followers. By the end of the book, you will be challenged to "die daily". The book is not a feel-good kind of read. But a tough, hard look at ourselves and what Jesus called us to.

Recommend? ABSOLUTELY! But it will not be comfortable. I believe every believer needs to read this for him or herself and every parent, grandparent, teacher should read this to help our young people understand to what Jesus calls us.

FYI: Kye Idleman has updated the original book with an additional chapter. I suggest getting the updated and expanded version. The first time I "read" the book it was an audiobook. That actually was great because it was on my mind throughout the day. Then I went back and read the hard copy. Glad I did it that way.
