## Seeking the Lord Together at Bethel

Have you lost or misplaced anything lately? Depending on what was lost, there was probably some sense of frustration or anxiety as the search was going on. Car keys, an old family photo and a certain tool come to my mind as I review my recent frantic searches. At Bethel, we have not lost or misplaced anything, but we are on a diligent search for the leading and direction of God regarding extending an invitation for Matt Dodd to become our Associate Pastor. It is definitely a search that the entire church family should be involved with in some way. What does God want us to do?

Finding God's direction is what we have been on a search for since we began posting a Bethel job description on job boards a year ago. Now after many months of meetings, interviews, references, and prayerful interaction, we arrive at a congregational vote this Sunday morning that will answer the question, what does God want us to do? The search committee, elders and church council believe that we should extend a call to the Dodd's to serve at Bethel in this way. Now together as a church family we seek the Lord for a clear direction.

Seeking the Lord is used in the Bible often as a way of describing prayer. For example, in Psalm 34:3-4 we are invited to joyful praise because the Lord answered when he was sought. This portrays seeking the Lord as a well-worn path that has been beaten down many, many times while praying for God to help you.

*Oh, magnify the Lord with me, and let us exalt his name together!  
I sought the Lord, and he answered me and delivered me from all my fears.*

Jesus uses the concept of seeking to describe prayer that is determined to find something. That something includes all the good things that God has promised us . . . such as directing our paths and wisdom to make good decisions.

*"Ask, and it will be given to you; seek, and you will find; knock, and it will be opened to you. 8 For everyone who asks receives, and the one who seeks finds, and to the one who knocks it will be opened. 9 Or which one of you, if his son asks him for bread, will give him a stone? 10 Or if he asks for a fish, will give him a serpent? 11 If you then, who are evil, know how to give good gifts to your children, how much more will your Father who is in heaven give good things to those who ask him! Matthew 7:7-8*

Beat a path to our heavenly Father. Earnestly looking for God's help until it is found. That is what we are doing. Please set aside some time this week or connect with a friend or two from Bethel to seek the Lord about our decision this Sunday.

Remember, this Sunday, Matt Dodd will preach in the morning service. After the worship service there will be a time of refreshments and fellowship in the Family Center followed by our congregational meeting at 11 in the Sanctuary. Children will attend their usual classes for Sunday School. We are looking forward to a great time together as we honor our Mothers, enjoy the ministry of the word, and seek the Lord together about this important decision of calling a pastor.
