Preparing for the Lord's Supper – Why Do We Do This?

Imagine being a child growing up in a home many centuries ago. Once a year your family gathers with others to celebrate their religion by killing a lamb and spreading the blood around the door of your house. As you get older you ask your parents, what does this mean or why do we do this (Exodus 12:26)?

Fast forward to the first Sunday of the month at Bethel Bible Church. What a great question from a child or a guest. Looking around they see people sipping and swallowing, some with heads bowed, some with eyes closed and some looking around as if to say – ‘is that white wafer like thing really Styrofoam?’ So, the question comes forth . . . What does this mean? Why do we do this? Just like Moses gave instructions to explain the Passover to the coming generations, how we practice and explain the Lord's Supper is a crucial part of helping communicate the gospel to our children (Exodus 12:21-28).


You could shape your answer in many ways. One helpful way is to put the Lord's Supper in the context of the other church celebration, baptism. Baptism is a person going public with their profession of faith in Jesus Christ as Lord and Savior. In baptism, the symbolism of going under the water and coming out is that of union with Jesus in his death, burial and resurrection. At baptism, the person is officially and publicly announcing “I am a follower of Jesus with these his people.”

When we celebrate the Lord's Supper (communion, the Lord's table), we are renewing our pledge of allegiance to Christ and his people. Remembering Jesus means to recall and retell, using the symbols of the bread and cup, the good news of Jesus' death and resurrection in such a way that each person relives it and renews their hope in it. At communion, the person is officially and publicly announcing “After reviewing the good news of Jesus, I renew my vows of commitment to Christ, his word and his people.”

Consequently, the Lord's Supper is reserved for only those who profess faith in Christ. Jesus commanded his followers to remember him in this way. So, why do we do this? To review the good news of forgiveness that Jesus provides through his death and resurrection. To renew our commitment to and hope in Christ – which includes admitting and confessing our sin. To rejoice in the blessings of serving Christ together in our church fellowship. We gather around the Lord's Table to proclaim the gospel of Jesus Christ.
