- **Pray for 2018!** Calvary Baptist Church is on the verge of some major and amazing decisions this coming year. We will also have more prayer meetings planned and scheduled to help us know God's will and way.
- **Pray for the Summer Jobs Grants program.** The government of Canada has demanded that charities seeking funding for summer jobs attest that they support rights including "reproductive rights" (including abortion) and non-discrimination based on sexual orientation. Pray for wisdom for Christian groups seeking to continue good work while remaining faithful to the teachings of Jesus Christ on sexuality and the sanctity of human life.
- **Pray for those hurting by economic setbacks.** Pray as the continued downturn in the Newfoundland economy works its way through business and government agencies, and for the people who will be displaced or face tighter financial constraints as a result. Please be praying for the members of our church who have been affected by an economic setback, and pray that those who are lacking work will find fulfilling, God-honouring work.
- **Pray for those struggling with substance addictions,** may we as a church learn to provide the support they need, and may they gain freedom in Jesus Christ by the power of the Holy Spirit. Pray also for ministries such as Teen Challenge, as they work to help people caught in addiction.
- **Pray as we seek to build community with each other.** Let's pray that God gives us hearts that are soft and open to those around us so that we can share the love of Christ.
- **Pray for each other:** That we will READ the Bible and PRAY every day. That our focus will be to pursue Holiness and that we will be a people who obey God out of love and not duty.
- **Pray for our government;** let's be intentional in obeying 1 Timothy 2.
- **Pray for the future of Calvary!** We need to address our facilities, keeping our focus on Jesus Christ and our being faithful to our call as a Church. 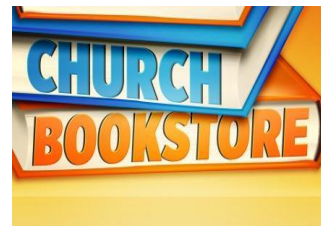
The Hunter Family asks us to join in praying for:

Why Mile One Mission? We believe that the souls of Newfoundland & Labrador are our primary calling & responsibility before God. We also acknowledge and embrace that our church is in

need of gospel partners to help us accomplish the *Acts 1:8* and *Matthew 28:18-20* commission. Thus, we believe a dedicated ministry that helps Calvary secure partners both financially & with human resources will increase our ability to raise up a new generation of Newfoundlanders to answer the call of reaching our province with the gospel. We now live and operate in a city that is only 1% evangelical, so the need is not only great but urgent & that requires radical prayer, humble desperation & amazing faith in Christ to help us do what can seem impossible from human perspective.

What is Mile One Mission? *Mile One Mission* will be a ministry of *Calvary* it that it will exist and function to help us live out the gospel, accomplish our mission statement & ultimately give God glory. *Mile One Mission* will function in submission to *Calvary* as it works to raise money, recruit interns & eventually church planters that will work under the authority of *Calvary* to see more churches established in or province. In essence, *Mile One Mission* will be the Jerusalem & Judea part of our *Acts 1:8* calling.

How will Mile One do this and where do we stand right now? We have already had \$14,00 given to *Mile One Mission* & have commitments for this year that will reach close to \$70,000. We will launch our Capital Campaign, "Building a Foundation for the Future." Selling 25,000 \$100 dollars bricks to pay for the new facility that will become the new home of *Calvary Baptist*. We hope to then secure church and donor partnerships of approximately \$500,000 per year to pay for mortgages, & salaries for interns, church planters etc.

What can you do? You can pray, support & ask God to bless! You can pray for this new ministry, you can give to it by supporting the ongoing operational budget of *Calvary*. You can serve by sitting on the committee, offering your home for Bible Studies, or house an intern. You can become a mentor, a home missionary, actively helping spread the gospel & you can be a cheerleader!

Church family, I believe that God is working each & every day. I get emails, Facebook messages, phone calls & texts from folks and churches who want to give, to pray, to come, to serve & to partner. God seems to be moving in the greater church to think about Newfoundland, St. John's and *Calvary Baptist Church!*
