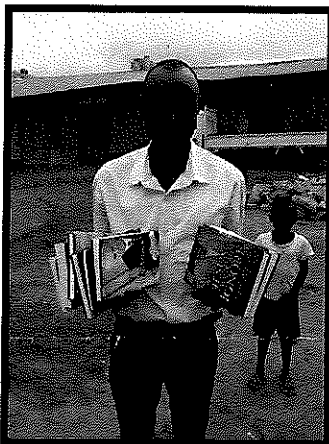
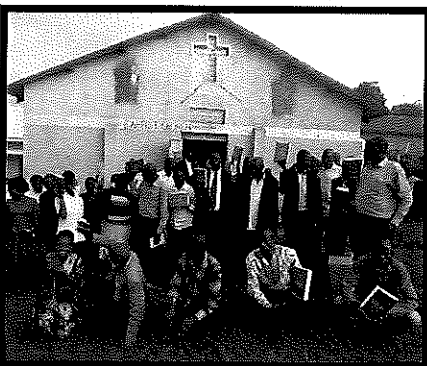

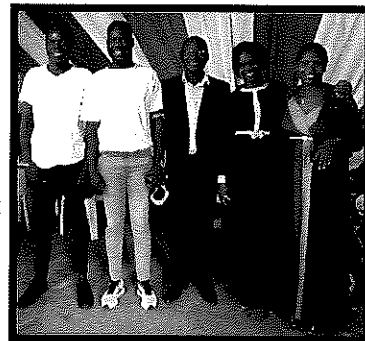

We were able to distribute 10 audio Bibles for the blind; our friend Ronnie Kaminyire wrote, "Dear Jim, Thank you for visiting us in Uganda and thinking about us always. 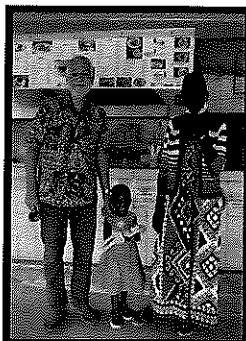

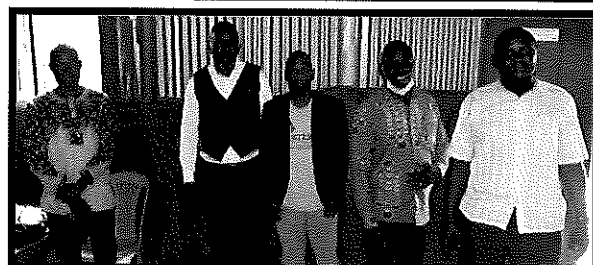

When people can't work, businesses suffer because people don't have the money to buy from them or pay for their services. They need our prayers, as always, but especially now.

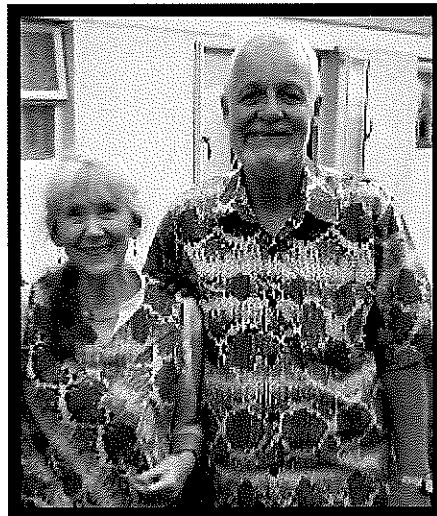

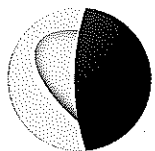
