WEDNESDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 8

Bildad, speaking in this chapter, is the second of Job's three friends. Bildad, who agrees with Eliphaz, that Job has sinned, and his suffering is just punishment. Bildad's words were, like Eliphaz, destructive. Bildad believed Job had sinned and needed to repent. Yet, God, Himself had assessed Job as blameless (1:1; 1:8). Bildad did not have the whole story, and we don't always either. It would be wise for us not to correct another person without first knowing more facts.

FRIDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 10

In today's passage, we see Job wondering why God allows him to live while experiencing nothing but agony and pain. Job becomes bitter, and he assumes that God will not reveal the charges against him. Job was at a deep level of despair and discouragement. Can you relate to these feelings? You are not alone. The key to overcoming is to stay fixed on the Lord and trust in His mercy and love.

THURSDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 9

"As this chapter shows, Job had been caught in a vicious downward spiral. His life had plunged deeper and deeper into despair. The more he pondered his devastating situation, the more his reasoning became distorted. What is worse, Job is jumping to wrong conclusions about God, making assumptions that were injurious to the reputation and honor of God. The truth is that God was not against Job, as he so loudly declared. Neither had Job committed any sin that had brought on this suffering. Yet Job had concluded both to be true." - Steven J. Lawson
