In today's passage, we see Job ponder the finality of death as he sinks deeper into the depths of despair. We, too, can be overcome by despair. Yet, we can rise above these discourage-ments. Remember that suffering is temporal. Remember that suffering is useful. Remember that suffering is Christlike. God uses our suffering to advance His kingdom and to make us more like Christ. Pray and ask the Lord to strengthen your heart during times of trial and dis-couragement.

Friday: Job 15

We, too, might conclude, as the friends of Job concluded, that his suffering was due to hidden sins. However, we can see that Job's life illustrates that suffering does not always indicate unrighteousness as to why a person is suffering. When you see another suffer, it would be wise not to make assumptions but rather pray as to how you can best be an encouragement and help to them.

Saturday: Prayer

Our outreach prayer this week is for Indian Bible College. Pray for the students and staff as classes begin January 18th. Also, pray for the Esplins as they look to purchase a home in Flagstaff.

Monday: Job 11

Anyone can criticize another, and we see that happening in this chapter of Job. Zophar is attacking Job, accusing him of unconfessed sin. Anyone can point out the perceived faults of another. However, we should be committed to helping those in times of difficulty. The Christian should be marked as those who help people overcome in times of suffering or failure.

Tuesday: Job 12

Job faced much criticism, and at one point or another, we will face it too. However, when we face trials and suffering, we know that God has ordained it and that we are serving Him. When criticized, we may react in a way that is not helpful or makes things worse. It is helpful to remember that when we endure unwarranted criticism, the key is how we respond, and that is with discernment. Pray and ask the Lord to give you discernment in all life areas, especially when being criticized.

Wednesday: Job 13

"It is supernatural — an evidence of the Holy Spirit at work — when praise wells up in our souls in the midst of our greatest pains. It is a taste of Job 13:15, where Job, in the vortex of such great sufferings, makes this beautiful declaration of allegiance to God: "Though he slay me, I will hope in him." By no means does such praise mean the pain is lessened. The hurt is every bit as real. But such a supernaturally inspired testimony to God does testify, Even as great as this pain is, God is greater." — David Mathis
