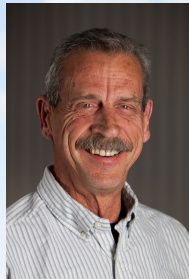

WEDNESDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 3

“After this Job opened his mouth and cursed the day of his birth. And Job said: ‘Let the day perish on which I was born, and the night that said, ‘A man is conceived.’” (vv. 1-3). Even through all that Job endured, he still did not curse God, the very thing Satan was after. Even through the most difficult of trials, God is not to be cursed. The believer knows that God is not only in control, but that God allows such things for a purpose. Remember the truth told in Romans 8:28: “And we know that for those who love God all things work together for good, for those who are called according to his purpose.”

THURSDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 4

“How can we be a good friend to someone who is hurting? Chapter 4 of Job provides the very antithesis of what we should be. In other words, Eliphaz shows us by negative example what a friend should not be. By looking at him, we can determine the very opposite of what we should be to others.” - Steven J. Lawson

FRIDAY

Wisdom Project: Job 5

Although Eliphaz was well-meaning, he was dangerous in what he spoke. He was being used as a tool of the devil to weaken Job’s faith in God. His arguments might have been crafted well, but they missed the mark with Job. All Eliphaz could think of were the things that Job had done to bring the crisis upon himself. But what he didn’t know was the battle going on between God and Satan. Eliphaz ended up darkening Job’s world instead of being a friend who sought to brighten it. This is a helpful reminder that we may not know the whole story when a friend is suffering. While seeking to help others, we also need to strive to ensure we’re not hurting at the same time. Pray and ask the Lord for wisdom when reaching out to a friend who needs help to be a real help to them.

Read through James 1 and spend time today in prayer in preparation for tomorrow’s sermon. Pray that the Lord would use the preaching of His word powerfully. Pray that your heart would be open to what He has for you.
