What do I learn about God?

Verse 11 says that we were washed, sanctified, and justified in the name of the Lord Jesus Christ. This means that the whole of salvation has His authority behind it. Our salvation is divine, and it is secure. Verse 11 also says that these things have happened by the power of the Spirit. God wants us to know that His Son is the authority to make our salvation happen, and His Spirit has worked this out in our lives.

Is there anything for which I should repent based on this text?

Is there any way that I have sought to "win" in disputes with other believers in a way that hurts the testimony of Christ and the church? As a church member, have I failed to help reconcile brothers and sisters when I've had the opportunity? Am I engaged in any of the sins listed in vv.9-10?

How might God use this passage to make me look more like Christ?

How does this passage affect evangelism?

How can I edify the church based on what this passage says?

I can be a great help to my brothers and sisters by being able to help them reconcile when there is conflict.
