Mark 8:31-9:1

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 1:12-26

“For it is written in the Book of Psalms, ‘May his camp become desolate, and let there be no one to dwell in it’; and ‘Let another take his office’” (v. 20). Quoting this Scripture was a reminder and a reassurance that Judah’s betrayal, and his replacement, were both according to God’s purposes. Let this serve as a reminder that God is working according to His purposes, which is a great comfort for us.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 2:1-13

The coming of the Holy Spirit is the fulfillment of what Jesus had promised (Acts 1:5). The Spirit had been active before but now had come in a powerful new way. The coming of the Holy Spirit also signifies that the beginning of the new covenant age had arrived. Pray to and praise the Holy Spirit for all that he has done and continues to do.

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 2:14-41

“So those who received his word were baptized, and there were added that day about three thousand souls” (v. 41). About 3,000 people were converted and added to the body of believers that day. They were added because “when they heard this, they were cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, ‘Brothers, what shall we do?’ And Peter said to them, ‘Repent and be baptized every one of you in the name of Jesus Christ for the forgiveness of your sins, and you will receive the gift of the Holy Spirit” (v. 37-38). For the believer, this is a familiar story. One hears, has faith, repents, and is baptized. What happened in the first days of the church is no different than what happens today. People believe because they hear the word of God. Pray and praise God for placing people in your life that He used to bring you to faith. Pray and ask the Lord to use you to do the same for others.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 2:42-47

“Churchless Christianity is wildly unbiblical. God’s people are called to live in loving and intentional community with one another, and never in isolation (Acts 2:42–47). This, of course, is by God’s design. He knows what His children need, and His Word is replete with passages underscoring the central role that the local church is meant to play in our lives. We need the means of grace of Word, sacraments, and prayer (Acts 2:42). We need spiritual oversight (Heb. 13:17). We need constant encouragement and accountability (Heb. 3:13). We need each other (Rom. 12:3–8; Eph. 4:1–16)” - Jon Payne

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 3:1-10

“And leaping up, he stood and began to walk, and entered the temple with them, walking and leaping and praising God” (v. 8). This man had been lame from birth, so leaping and praising God, after being healed, is an appropriate response. Consider how the Lord has healed your sinful heart. We, too, should be just a joyful, with leaping and praising God, for what He has done in our lives.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 3:11-26

“At Pentecost, Peter preached that Jesus had been raised from the dead. He amplified this by saying that the Jews he was addressing had been guilty of crucifying Him, and that His resurrection and ascension meant that Jesus was Lord of Lords (Acts 2:36). Doubtless this caused consternation in Jerusalem, but only 3,000 people joined this new sect, so the rulers of the Jews let it pass. Then Peter healed a lame man. Large numbers of people became excited. Peter preached the same message, a message of condemnation but also of hope (Acts 3:26). The Jewish rulers called Peter in before them. Peter preached the same message to them (Acts 4:10–12). The Jews commanded Peter not to preach this message, but Peter told them that he would not stop (Acts 4:18–20).” - Ligonier.org

Peter reminds us not to stop preaching about Christ. Every chance we get, we should use it to tell others about our Savior.
