MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 20:24-29

"Thomas answered him, 'My Lord and my God!' Jesus said to him, 'Have you believed because you have seen me? Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have believed'" (v. 28-29). Jesus makes it clear that there is no disadvantage in reading John's gospel (those who have not seen) compared to the first followers of Jesus (those who have seen). Jesus calls those who have not seen and believed blessed. Praise God that faith comes by hearing the word of Christ (Romans 10:17).

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 20:30-31

"But these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in his name" (v. 31). This gospel was written for one purpose, that people would believe in Jesus. Pray that your time through this book would help you be better equipped to share Christ with others. Pray for opportunities to share this gospel with others in the hope that they would believe.



Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: John 21:1-14

"Verse 1 says this: 'After this Jesus revealed himself again to the disciples by the Sea of Tiberias, and he revealed himself in this way.' So John's setting the stage here. John is insistent that we know that Jesus is alive. 'After this Jesus revealed himself again...' John's already told us of a couple other times that Jesus revealed himself after he rose from the dead. John wants us to know that this man is alive."

Gospel & Acts Project: John 21:20-25

FRIDAY

"Now there are also many other things that Jesus did. Were every one of them to be written, I suppose that the world itself could not contain the books that would be written" (v. 25). There is so much more that Christ did that the world could not contain it in books. Yet we do not have those books. We have what the Lord wants us to know, and that is enough to bring people to faith in Christ. Praise God that He gave us exactly what is needed for salvation.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: John 21:15-19

"What we should take note of is that Jesus tells Peter in three different ways to feed and take care of His sheep. Jesus gave Peter the duty of shepherding His people, of teaching them the truth that feeds their souls. Of course, this commission was not limited to Peter but extended to all the Apostles, and Peter explains that it is also given to the elders throughout the church age (1 Peter 5:1–4). Church leaders are to care for believers, knowing that they belong ultimately to Christ and that they need the truth of God's Word for their good." - Ligonier.org

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 1:1-11

Jesus presented Himself to the Apostles and others and gave many proofs as evidence of His resurrection. Jesus provided not only the evidence that He truly did rise from the grave, but also gave confidence to the Apostles to go out and proclaim the message of Christ. When you read this passage, you, too, should have the confidence to go out and proclaim the message of Christ. Pray for faith and boldness to go out and share Christ with the world.
