MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 4:1-22

“And there is salvation in no one else, for there is no other name under heaven given among men by which we must be saved” (v. 12). Peter and John had been arrested while preaching Christ. The next day Peter preaches Christ to those who had arrested him. No matter the circumstance, we should follow Peter’s example and always look for a way to preach Christ.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 4:23-37

Peter and John had been arrested for preaching Christ. They reported that the Jewish leaders had charged them not to speak in Jesus' name (v. 18). The response is that the Christians prayed for the power to witness even more boldly. Pray that this is your response when persecuted. Pray for boldness in your witness of Christ.

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 5:1-16

“Scripture teaches in a number of ways that the Holy Spirit is fully God. One key passage is Acts 5:1-11, where Ananias and Sapphira lie about the proceeds they derived from the sale of their property. They are said to have lied to the Holy Spirit and to have not lied to man but “to God” (v. 4). To lie to the Holy Spirit is to lie to God because the Spirit is fully and completely God. This is why grieving the Spirit is something to be avoided. When we persist in sin, we are grieving the Spirit, and by grieving the Spirit, we grieve God. It is not that we provoke the Lord to get depressed—which would be impossible—but that we turn ourselves away (albeit temporarily) from His empowerment and assurance.” - Ligonier.org

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 5:17-42

“Then they left the presence of the council, rejoicing that they were counted worthy to suffer dishonor for the name” (v. 41). The apostles had been arrested, and they rejoiced in their suffering for Jesus. Suffering for Jesus is not something to be afraid of or ashamed of; it is something to rejoice in. Pray that when you suffer for Jesus, there is rejoicing.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 6:1-15

Seven men were chosen to serve so that the church leaders could devote themselves to prayer and the ministry of the word. There is much that needs to get done in a church, but the church leaders’ highest priorities are to prayer and ministry of the word. Pray for the leaders of our church. Pray for our elders as they devote themselves to these high priorities.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 7:1-60

“Stephen had just preached a message to the Jewish leaders, and his main point was that the essence of their religion was self-worship, not God-worship. They rejoiced in the work of their own hands not in God (Acts 7:41, 48). When Stephen came to the end of his message, the council was enraged and ground their teeth at him (Acts 7:54). God’s response to Stephen at this moment was exactly the opposite. He filled Stephen with his Holy Spirit (v. 55). This is not exceptional. You can expect God to do this for you if you walk with him. ‘Though I walk through the valley of the shadow of death, I will fear no evil, for thou art with me’ (Psalm 23:4). God draws near to the dying saint.”
