HELP FROM THE GOD OF THE HILLS Psalm 121

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 8:1-25

"And Saul approved of his execution. And there arose on that day a great persecution against the church in Jerusalem, and they were all scattered throughout the regions of Judea and Samaria, except the apostles" (v. 1). This scattering, this dispersion, is a fulfillment of the promise in Acts 1:8. That promise was that the gospel would go out to the end of the earth. The gospel has gone out, and it keeps going. Pray that the gospel continues to be spread throughout all nations.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 8:26-40

Today's passage reminds us that the Holy Spirit guides and directs us in our witnessing. The Scripture passage the eunuch was reading, Isaiah 53:7-8, was clearly of the Spirits leading. It was the Holy Spirit that directed Philip to approach the eunuch. The Holy Spirit directed both Philip and the eunuch to arrive at a rare watering-place, in the desert, precisely when the eunuch requested baptism. Praise the Holy Spirit for His working and ask Him to help lead you in your witnessing for Christ.

Wednesday

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 9:1-19a

"Along the way to Damascus, Jesus spoke to Saul. A great light from heaven, which Saul would have recognized as the glory of God, accompanied the words of Jesus. Jesus told Saul that in persecuting the church he was persecuting Jesus Himself, because the Lord is associated with His body. Jesus told Saul to go to Damascus and await instructions. When Saul got up, he found that he was blind. Saul now realized that the Christian claim was correct. The Lord who appeared to Israel in the shekinah glory in the Old Testament became incarnate and was now enthroned at the right hand of the Father. There have been few conversions as dramatic as Paul's. True conversion, however, need not be dramatic to be authentic. Think back on your conversion. Thank God for 'invading' your life and calling you." - Ligonier.org

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 9:19b-31

"So the church throughout all Judea and Galilee and Samaria had peace and was being built up. And walking in the fear of the Lord and in the comfort of the Holy Spirit, it multiplied" (v. 31). "Fear of the Lord," a common theme in Acts, does not refer to fear of final judgment. For the believer, there is no fear of final judgment because Christ's finished work on the cross. Our debt of sin was canceled at the cross.

Now why this fear and unbelief
Has not the Father put to grief
His spotless Son for us
And will the righteous Judge of men
Condemn me for that debt of sin
Now canceled at the cross

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 9:32-43

FRIDAY

"Lydda, Peter's first stop, was about twenty miles west of Jerusalem on the way to Joppa, which was about twelve miles farther. In Lydda, Peter healed a lame believer named Aeneas, and the whole city converted to the faith. Then Peter was summoned to Joppa by two men who told him that one of the most faithful and important women in the church had died. Her name was Dorcas, and she had a significant ministry helping widows and the poor. Peter prayed for her and then raised her from the dead. As a result, many in Joppa also believed in the Lord (Acts 9:32–43). Think about your own locality. How is the Gospel spreading in your town, city, or metropolitan area? Evaluate your part in the spread of the Gospel." - Ligonier.org

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 10:1-33

"And the voice came to him again a second time, 'What God has made clean, do not call common'" (v. 15). With this, God overturned the old clean/unclean dietary laws. God did not want anything like dietary laws getting in the way of fellowship with the Gentiles. What God did here was to make unity possible, in the church, between converted Jews and converted Gentiles. We see God prizing unity in the church. Pray for unity in the church. Pray that you would prize unity in the church and make it a priority.
