MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 10:34-48

"Jesus put it in a picture. He compares the freedom of the Spirit to the freedom of the wind. In John 3:8 he says, 'The wind blows where it wills, and you hear the sound of it, but you do not know whence it comes or whither it goes; so is every one who is born of the Spirit.' The Holy Spirit is as free as the wind. You can't see him. You can't control him. Suddenly he is around you and in you. You did not make him come any more than you can rule the wind. He is free. That's the way he came in Acts 10. Before the sermon was over, before any formal invitation for him to come, suddenly he was there. Verse 44: 'While Peter was still saying this, the Holy Spirit fell on all who heard the word.'" – John Piper

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 11:1-18

"When they heard these things they fell silent. And they glorified God, saying, 'Then to the Gentiles also God has granted repentance that leads to life'" (v. 18). There had been a history of tension between the Jews and the Gentiles. Seeing that God had granted re-pentance, to the Gentiles, the Jewish Christians glorified God. A key theme of the gospel is reconciliation. Through granting repentance, to the Gentiles, they were reconciled to God and with the Jewish Christians. In other words, two groups, that had once been at odds were being unified together in Christ. Pray and praise the Lord for being reconciled to Him. Pray and ask the Lord that more be reconciled to Him and be unified with His church.

Wednesday Friday

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 11:19-30

"And the hand of the Lord was with them, and a great number who believed turned to the Lord" (v. 21). We are reminded here that the expansion of the church came about by God's power. The expansion, of the church, does not come about by any human wisdom or skill. God uses us to accomplish His purposes, but it is ultimately God that causes peo-ple to turn "to the Lord." Praise the Lord for His power working in our lives and in the lives of those who are coming to faith. Pray and ask Him to use you for His purposes.

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 12:20-25

An angel of the Lord struck Herod down because he did not give glory to God. Herod was receiving wrongful praise and he was delighting in that praise. When Peter received wrongful worship he reacted with an instant rejection of that worship (Acts 10:26). The two reactions, to wrongful praise and worship, revealed the condition of their hearts. Our reactions, to things that happen to us, reveals our true hearts. Pray and ask the Lord to give you a heart that desires to reflect Christ.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 12:1-19

Herod had executed the apostle James and had imprisoned Peter. Herod's intention was to ex-ecute Peter also. "So Peter was kept in prison, but earnest prayer for him was made to God by the church" (v. 5). The rest of the passage details Peter's deliverance from prison. However, before his rescue, there was earnest prayer being made for Peter. The situation was dire. James and been killed and Peter was about to be. There was little anyone could do, other then pray. At times there may be a situation where there is little you can do but pray. But prayer is powerful. If all you can do, in a situation, is prayer, then pray. Pray and trust the Lord that His will is being done.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 13:1-12

James Montgomery Boice writes: "The Holy Spirit is not a power for us to use. He is a Person, the Third person of the Trinity. So rather than thinking of the Holy Spirit being a power that we are somehow to seize and use, we are to think of Him as a person whose job it is to use us. Acts gives us this contrast. In acts 8 we have Simon wanting to get to use the Holy Spirit, but in acts 13 we have the Holy Spirit getting hold of and using Barnabas and Paul." As you read, through the book of Acts, keep in mind that it is the Holy Spirit that is doing the work through the Apostles and others. Remember that the Holy Spirit is no less active today. Pray and ask the Holy Spirit to work mightily in your life for the sake of the gospel and for his glory.
