WHEN UNRIGHTEOUSNESS ABOUNDS Romans 3:1-20

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 17:22-34

"Now when they heard of the resurrection of the dead, some mocked. But others said, 'We will hear you again about this.' So Paul went out from their midst. But some men joined him and believed, among whom also were Dionysius the Areopagite and a woman named Damaris and others with them" (vv. 32-34). When we tell other of Christ's death and resurrection, some will mock, others will want to hear more of it, and others will believe. We don't know what we will encounter when telling others about Jesus. We know that God is glorified and pleased when we do as we have been commanded (Matt. 28:19). Pray that when you witness, God's will is done, and trust that it will be.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 18:1-17

Paul preached Christ and was reviled for it. Paul tells the Jews, "Your blood be on your own heads! I am innocent." The Jews' failure to believe was not because Paul had failed to tell them about Christ. Christians have the responsibility to proclaim Christ. They are not responsible if those who hear reject. Paul had been faithful in his responsibility to preach Christ, and we too ought to be faithful in our responsibility.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 18:18-23

"After spending some time there, he departed and went from one place to the next through the region of Galatia and Phrygia, strengthening all the disciples" (v. 23). We've seen how Paul diligently preached Christ. Here we see that Paul also spent time strengthening disciples. We do have a responsibility to share the gospel, but we also have a responsibility to help other Christians. Read Ephesians 4:1-16 and ask the Lord to use you to build up the body in love for greater unity in the body of Christ.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 18:24-28

"He began to speak boldly in the synagogue, but when Priscilla and Aquila heard him, they took him aside and explained to him the way of God more accurately" (v. 26). Apollos' knowledge of the Christian gospel was lacking. What he spoke was right, as far as he knew. Priscilla and Aquila took Apollos aside to correct him, not in public, but in private. They explained to him, "the way of God more accurately." We see a beautiful picture of the Holy Spirit using these two women to bring about church growth. Take time to praise the Holy Spirit for His work in your life.

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 19:1-10

Spurgeon on Acts 19:2: "It may be well to notice what question the apostle did not put to these Ephesian disciples of John. He did not say to them, "Have ye believed?" This would have been a very important question, but it ought to be settled once for all. Our faith must either be boldly affirmed or sorrowfully denied, but it should not remain the subject of question. It is a great pity that so many Christians are always saying, "Have I believed?" and allowing that most vital point to be a matter of debate; for as long as the existence of faith within our souls is the subject of question, we must be unhappy. Faith is the corner-stone of the edifice of godliness, and if it be not well laid, and known to be well laid, there can be no sense of security to the inhabitant of the house. We not only ought to know that we believe, but to know whom we believe, and it would be well for us to advance beyond common believing to assurance, and thence to full assurance,— the assurance of faith, the assurance of hope, and the assurance of understanding."

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 19:11-20

In today's passage, many miracles occurred in Ephesus through Paul (vv. 11-12). While there, Paul encountered others who were pursuing false ways of working miracles, including would be Jewish exorcists (vv. 13-16) and those with faith in magical spells (vv. 17-19). It is verse 20 that should catch our attention. "So the word of the Lord continued to increase and prevail mightily." There is power in "the word of the Lord." Luke is showing us that the gospel is triumphant over demonic powers. The Bible is powerful because it is the word of God, and it prevails.
