

# Thursday: Ecclesiastes 1

"If you want to know God better, it will be costly, and it will be worth it. For in much wisdom is much vexation, and he who increases knowledge increases sorrow (Ecclesiastes 1:18). That is true. It's true because the more we know...the more we know that suffering abounds...the more we are accountable to live up to...the more dementia will take away. But it is worth it. There is gold and abundance of costly stones; but the lips of knowledge are a precious jewel (Proverbs 20:15). You will know the truth, and the truth will set you free (John 8:32)." – John Piper

# Friday: Ecclesiastes 2

"I said in my heart, 'Come now, I will test you with pleasure; enjoy yourself.' But behold, this also was vanity. I said of laughter, 'It is mad,' and of pleasure, 'What use is it?'" (Ecc. 2:1-2). The writer uses words like pleasure and laughter to point us to the idea that a lighthearted approach to life is foolish and not wise. Of course, these things, in and of themselves, are not necessarily foolish. However, when they are the approach to life, it is foolish of us to do so and vanity.

## **Monday: Proverbs 29**

"A man who flatters his neighbor spreads a net for his feet. An evil man is ensnared in his transgression, but a righteous man sings and rejoices," (Prov. 29:5-6). This proverb tells us that a person who seeks to ensnare another will, eventually, ensnare himself. This proverb reminds us where our hearts need to be. Our hearts should desire to be for others and not against them.

## **Tuesday: Proverbs 30**

Proverbs 30:10 warns against lying, specifically that of a servant lying to their master. Doing so could cause problems with their position affecting their livelihood. This proverbs remind us of Colossians 3:22: "Bondservants, obey in everything those who are your earthly masters, not by way of eye-service, as people-pleasers, but with sincerity of heart, fearing the Lord."

# Wednesday: Proverbs 31

"Few influences affect a man's heart for God more than his wife, for better or for worse. She will either encourage his spiritual devotion to the Lord or she will hinder it. She will either enlarge his passion for God or she will pour cold water on it. What kind of wife encourages her husband's spiritual growth? Proverbs 31:10–31 provides a profile of the wife who is worthy of her husband's trust. Such a wife is the embodiment of true wisdom from God, causing the husband to confide in her with complete trust." - Steven Lawson


