# THE UNRIGHTEOUS WORLD Romans 1:18-32

## MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 13:13-52

"And the disciples were filled with joy and with the Holy Spirit" (v. 52). Being filled, or indwelt, with the Holy Spirit, occurs at the time of salvation. From then on, the believer is called to live under the influence of the Spirit. Being "filled with the Spirit" (Eph. 5:18) leads to living a godly life and should be a regular life pattern.

## **TUESDAY**

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 14:1-18

In today's passage, we learn that when Paul and Barnabas went to Iconium and preached, many believed, both Jew and Greek. They continued to speak boldly for the Lord, but some sought to stone them. The two fled, but wherever they went, "they continued to preach the gospel" (v. 7). May this serve as an example to us. When we preach the gospel, some may believe, and some may not. We do know that we will face persecution. Through it all, we still keep preaching the gospel.

Wednesday Friday

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 14:19-28

The stoning of Paul was so severe that they believed they had succeeded, as they supposed "that he was dead" (v. 19). Paul would later speak of the stoning along with beatings and shipwrecks (2 Cor. 11:25). Paul's sufferings were for a purpose, and that purpose was the gospel. Paul suffered for the gospel, and we are called to suffer for the gospel as well. Pray and ask the Lord that when you suffer, you suffer well for the sake of the gospel.

## THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 15:1-21

"The Apostles did not believe the Mosaic law had no place in the lives of Gentile Christians. Acts 15:19–21 reveals that all believers are bound by God's eternal moral law, which is found in the Mosaic code alongside ceremonial and civil legislation. Before Christ, the Lord did not condemn the Gentiles for not keeping Israel's ceremonial rules, but only for violating the moral law found on the consciences of all people (Amos 1:1–2:3). This did not change when the Gentiles became full members of the new covenant."

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 15:22-35

"Then it seemed good to the apostles and the elders, with the whole church, to choose men from among them and send them to Antioch with Paul and Barnabas" (v. 22a). "It seemed good" to them because they had used mature, Christian reasoning, which was dependent on the Lord. The result was a unanimous decision. Dependence on the Lord, reasoning from Scripture, in a mature way, brings people together. There was unity in the decision because there was unity in the process. Continue to pray for unity in all aspects of the church.

## SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 15:36-41

"One of the most hurtful struggles in life occurs when strife divides the community of faith. The apostle Paul teaches that we are one body (1 Cor. 12:12), that we should pursue unity through the Spirit (Eph. 4:3), and that as we are able we should live in peace with all men (Rom. 12:18). But even Paul, it seems, was not spared a guarrel with Barnabas that led to their separation over the matter of John Mark (Acts 15:36–41). Only many years later was Paul's offense regarding Mark resolved, for just before his death the apostle acknowledged that Mark had become profitable for the ministry (2 Tim. 4:11). Sadly, sometimes quarrels with our brothers in the faith are not resolved in our lifetime. How are we to understand these long lasting divisions within the body of faith, schisms that seem to become permanent when healing does not come before death? Surely we will be unified in our love in heaven, but is there no emblem of our unity on earth? Is the triumph of truth reserved for eternity only, or is there the hope of healing in time?" - Warren Gage
