Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 25:1-12

“There are certain ‘defining moments’ that forever change the identity and destiny of an individual, a movement, a nation. The moment may be as commonplace as the birth of a child or as unique as the extraordinary British defeat of the Spanish Armada. The defining moment for all of human history and for every individual is the resurrection of Jesus Christ. Prisoner Paul boldly proclaims this before Festus, Agrippa and Bernice in the final missionary preaching in Acts. To embrace this proclamation is to permit the purpose of Luke-Acts to be fulfilled in one’s life (Lk 1:1-4).”

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 26:1-11

“And now I stand here on trial because of my hope in the promise made by God to our fathers” (v. 6). Paul was on trial because of his “hope in the promise,” the coming of the Messiah and His kingdom. Once an enemy of Christ and persecutor of His people, Paul has His very hope in Christ. His hope was in Christ to the point where he was on trial because of it. Paul, once an enemy of Christ, is now a faithful servant. Pray for faith like Paul’s. One where you are willing to be put on trial for the hope you have in Christ. Pray for enemies of Christ to become faithful followers of Him.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 25:13-27

“Paul uses this opportunity to preach one of the greatest sermons ever recorded.” - J. Vernon McGee
In today’s passage, and what came before, the Lord used to set up an opportunity for Paul to preach the gospel before a king, and Paul seized that opportunity. The Lord is sovereign and, in His providence, provides opportunities for Christians to share the good news of Christ. Pray for those opportunities and pray for boldness when they come that you too would seize the opportunity for Christ.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 26:12-32

“Acts 26:20 and 1 Thessalonians 1:9–10 are two texts that demonstrate the truth that conversion is the start of a journey. In the first of these texts, Paul emphasizes that conversion begins with a radical turning to God in repentance that issues in a lifetime of living out the implications of that turning by ‘performing deeds in keeping with [that] repentance.’ The second text describes the conversion of the Thessalonians as consisting in a radical turning to God from idols, issuing in a life of bondservice to the living God, and an eager waiting for the completion of salvation to be bestowed at the return of Jesus.”
