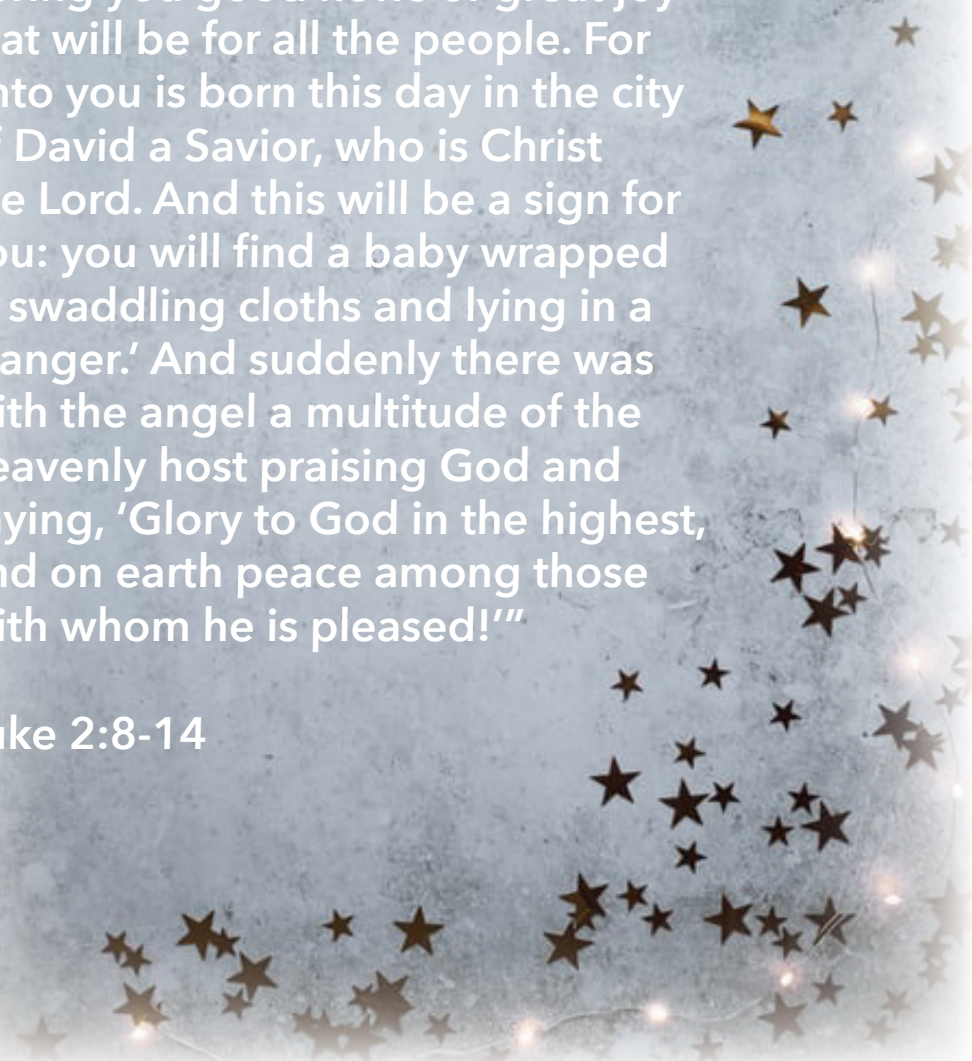

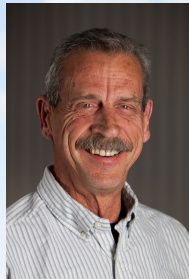

A LIFE OF SERVICE

Mark 9:30-41

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 21:27-36

“For the mob of the people followed, crying out, ‘Away with him!’” (v. 36). The crowd shouting, “away with him” or killing him, echoes the crowd’s shout that that demanded Jesus’ execution (Luke 23:18). Paul was being arrested over a false charge that he violated the temple. Christ has something to say about those who are accused of falsely on His account. “Blessed are you when others revile you and persecute you and utter all kinds of evil against you falsely on my account” (Matt. 5:11).

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 21:37-22:21

“And now why do you wait? Rise and be baptized and wash away your sins, calling on his name” (Acts 22:16). It is not the physical act of baptism that cleanses a person spiritually of sin. Baptism is to be viewed as an outward symbol of sin’s cleansing when someone trusts in Jesus. It is belief that leads to cleansing, and baptism pictures this.

WEDNESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 22:22-29

“The declaration of citizenship has its desired effect: the military interrogators withdrew immediately. Paul, though still a prisoner, will be viewed differently from now on. In fact, alarm or fear grips the tribune as he realizes that he violated one of the basic rights of a Roman citizen when he put Paul . . . in chains (21:33). As the Roman orator Cicero exclaimed, ‘To bind a Roman is a crime, to flog him is an abomination, to slay him is almost an act of murder.’ Paul’s use of his Roman citizenship teaches us that as an expression of God’s moral order, and when the laws governing its exercise of power are just, the state may be appealed to for protection of the physical well-being of law-abiding citizens. The Christian’s appeal must always be in the interest of the advance of the gospel.” -IVP New Testament Commentary

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 22:30-23:11

“And Paul said, ‘I did not know, brothers, that he was the high priest, for it is written, ‘You shall not speak evil of a ruler of your people.’” (v. 23:5). Paul knew every detail of the law and knew that rulers were to be respected. Regardless of what was happening to him, Paul sought to do what was right before God. 1 Peter 2:17 tells us, “Honor everyone. Love the brotherhood. Fear God. Honor the emperor.” Pray and ask God to help you show honor and respect to all of your leaders.

FRIDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 23:12-22

In today’s passage, we read of a plot to put Paul to death. However, the Lord makes it clear that he has other plans for Paul. Paul is to go to Rome. No plan of man is outside of God’s sovereignty. God allows things to happen, but it is always in keeping with His will. Pray and thank the Lord that He is sovereign over every aspect of your life.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Acts 23:23-35

J. Vernon McGee on Acts 23:30-35: “We will find that his accusers were quick to come down to Caesarea. They didn’t hesitate to follow Paul. As we move along, I think you will detect that Paul is not defending himself as much as he is witnessing for Christ. The Lord Jesus had said he would witness before governors and rulers and Kings. He is being brought before them. This is God’s method. Paul is in the will of God, and God is carrying out His purpose.”
