**Thursday: Job 34**

“The counsel of Job’s three friends was skewed because it came from a false view of God. Only Elihu had an accurate view of God and, thus, only he gave divine counsel and understanding to Job that represented God correctly. The starting point of true, biblical counsel must be an accurate view of God.” - Steven J. Lawson

**Friday: Job 35**

In today’s passage, Elihu asserts that God does care for those who are suffering. However, God’s care comes in His perfect timing. Remember that God’s timing is not ours, and in His sovereignty, He knows when the right time is. In times of trials and suffering, pray for God’s comfort, but also pray that you will trust Him and in His perfect timing.

**Saturday: Prayer**

Continue in prayer for the Standridge family, missionaries in Italy. Praise that Jenny was granted permission to remain in the country and that license only needs to be renewed every five years. Pray for her classes as she continues to learn the language. Pray for their children as they are also learning the language. Also, pray that as restrictions are being lifted, they have additional opportunities for ministry and evangelism.

**Monday: Job 31**

Job pledges that his eyes and heart will remain pure toward other women (31:1). This commitment is to avoid lusting after other women. To break this commitment would be sin (Matt. 5:28), and Job had determined not to do so. Read Matthew 5:27-30. Pray and ask the Lord to help your heart to flee when tempted with lust.

**Tuesday: Job 32**

Wise counsel can come from unexpected sources. Elihu looked to God, not man, for understanding in Job's situation. Although the others were his senior, which might appear to place him at a disadvantage, his God-given knowledge was more applicable to Job's situation. Our desire, when helping others, ought to be based on the understanding that is from God. When receiving wise and godly counsel, it shouldn't matter who is giving it; we should listen.

**Wednesday: Job 33**

Job needed to hear what God was saying to him. In today's passage, Elihu is pleading with Job to listen as he will speak the truth as given to him by God's Spirit. It is not unheard of that we don't listen because we don't want to hear what is being said. What Job needed is what we need. To listen to what the Lord is saying. Job needed to listen more than he spoke. The same might be true of us, which is to listen more than we talk.

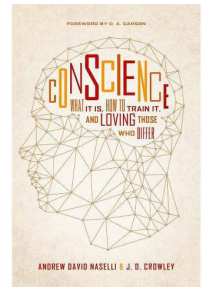
## Book of the Month
