Thursday: Job 39

God's answering of Job continues in this chapter, and we see details of God's sovereignty over His creation. God rules over the goat (39:1), God rules over the doe (39:1-4), God rules over the donkey (39:5-8), and the list goes on. God is not only showing Job His sovereignty over everything but also how little Job knows. It is a sobering and humbling reality for Job and even to us. There is so much to learn, and much we do not understand. Humbly, pray and ask the Lord to continue to teach you.

Friday: Job 40

To demonstrate that He alone is Creator, God speaks of the behemoth, a powerful creature that God has the power to harness. Job could not control the behemoth; only God can. Job must submit himself to God who made and controls everything. Not only Job, but all creation must bow before the Creator and yield their lives to Him.

Saturday: Prayer

"Yavapai Territorial Gospel Rescue Mission believes that any life can be changed through the name of Jesus Christ. They believe no one is beyond saving and that through the power of the Holy Spirit, the love of God can be experienced by 'even the least of these.'" Pray that many would come to know Christ through the work of the Gospel Rescue Mission.

Monday: Job 36

Elihu reminds Job that God is good and God works for Job's benefit. We, too, know that for the Christian God works for our benefit. Ponder this and think about where you could go, in Scripture, to find comfort when suffering through trials. Find those passage those passages, pray those passages to God, and ask Him for comfort.

Tuesday: Job 37

In today's passage, we see Elihu describe God's power like a thunderstorm and a snowstorm. Elihu did this to indicate God's power and control over Job's life. Elihu brought attention to God's sovereignty over Job's life and called him to submit to God. God is completely sovereign over all things, including your life. In all circumstances, God is in control. Trust this and submit every aspect of your life to God.

Wednesday: Job 38

The Lord answers and asks Job whether he knows how creation was established? If he has the knowledge or the ability to govern it? Or even shape its creatures' lives? God is overwhelming Job with a display of His sovereignty. God is confronting Job about his calling God into question. In doing so, God is humbling Job with these questions; none Job can answer. We could not answer those questions either. We, too, should be humbled by the power and sovereignty of God.

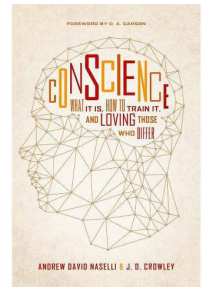
Book of the Month
