IS GOD REALLY GOOD?

Psalm 73

MONDAY

Prophet Project

Tomorrow we begin the Prophet Project. Throughout the year we will read through both the major and minor prophets. Take time to pray for this upcoming year and your study in the Bible. Pray that whatever you are reading that the Holy Spirit will illuminate Scripture and give you a greater understanding. Pray that as you study you grow in Christlikeness all to give greater glory to God!

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 1:1-31

In the book of Isaiah, God comes right out of the gates condemning the fake religious practice of Judah. It wasn't that they had stopped their practice of worship, but that their hearts had grown cold. In other words, Judah was all form and no substance. While it is easy to sit in judgment on them, the truth is that the same thing can happen to us. How do you approach your Bible reading and prayer time? What about corporate worship on Sunday mornings? It is all too easy for us to fall into the same trap of empty practice with a cold and calloused heart. Ask God to purify your heart and keep you from simply going through the motions.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 2:1-22

In this passage consider verse 11: “The haughty looks of man shall be brought low, and the lofty pride of men shall be humbled, and the Lord alone will be exalted in that day.” What Isaiah sees as what is wrong with the world are “the haughty looks” and “the lofty pride of men.” The only remedy for this the exclusive exaltation of the Lord. Verse 17 tells us: “And the haughtiness of man shall be humbled, and the lofty pride of men shall be brought low, and the Lord alone will be exalted in that day.” Pray today that all you do is to exalt the Lord and make much of Him.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 4:2-6

The term “branch” in Old Testament prophecy, is often a title that refers to the Messiah we now know as Jesus. Today’s reading shows us the future that Jesus Christ will bring to His world when He returns. While it may currently seem that sin and Satan have the upper hand, we know that Jesus is coming and will make all things new (Rev. 21:5). Let the thoughts of that future day and the truth about it which Scripture reveals carry you through the difficult times today. The end of the story is that God and His people win!

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 3:1-4:1

Judah and Jerusalem had been warned. Though things had gone so well for them, their time of prosperity caused them to take for granted all that God had provided, and their hearts went astray. Here, the future judgment against Judah and Jerusalem is prophesied and would be partially fulfilled in 586 B.C. when Nebuchadnezzar II completed his three-year siege on Jerusalem by destroying the city and its temple. These things are written for our instruction, and may we learn — in the midst of our great prosperity — never to allow our it to become us stumbling block to us. May we always see ourselves as needy for God, needy for his ways, and needy for his grace.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 5:1-30

For Isaiah God is both the Holy One and his beloved. “Let me sing for my beloved,” Isaiah says (v. 1). As a Christian you know that God is the Holy One, but is God also your beloved? Do you dearly love God? Is your love for God expressed in this way? Seek to love God in a way that is like Isaiah, where you look upon God as not only the Holy One, but as your beloved.
