



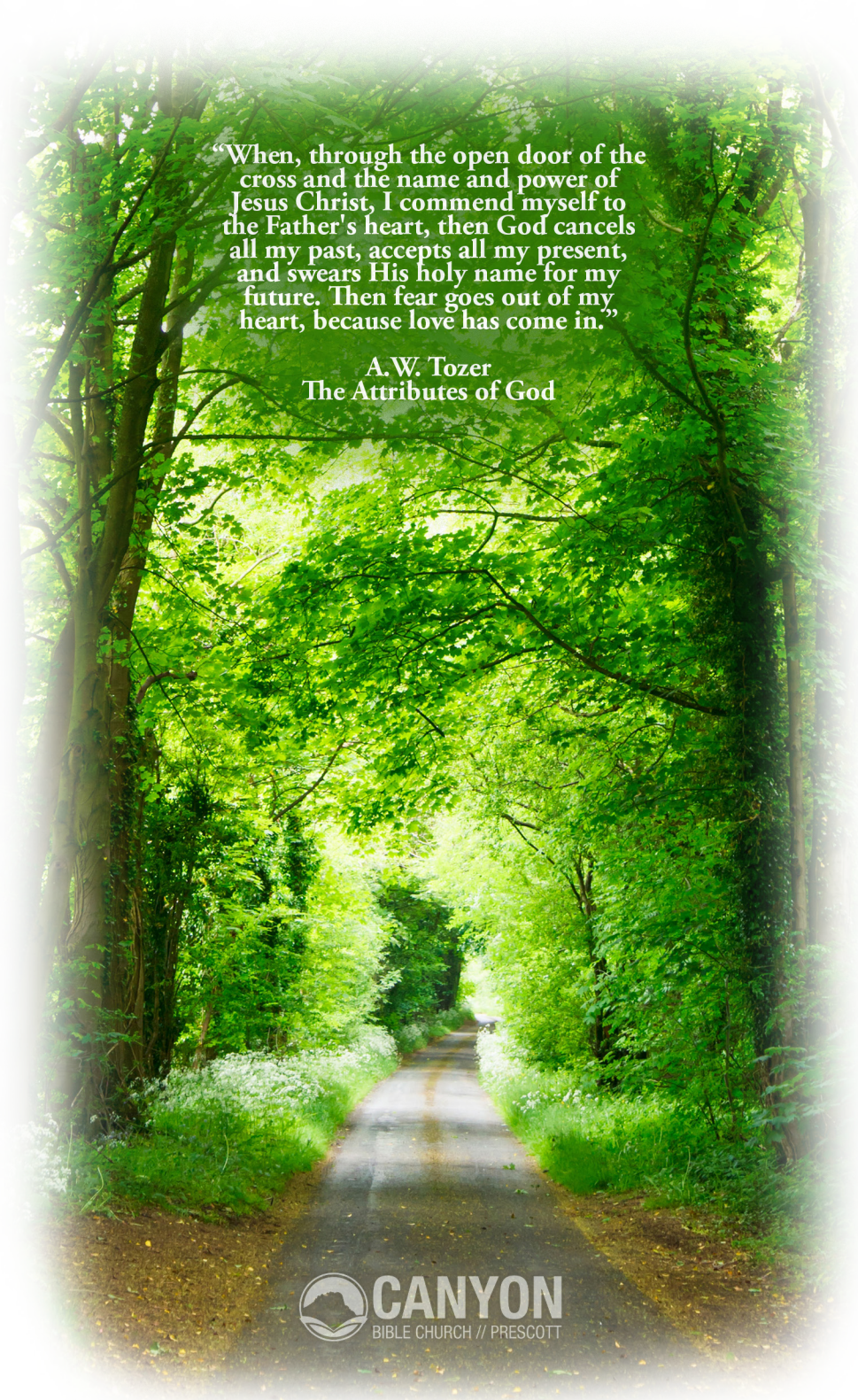

DON'T IMITATE BULLIES

3 John 9-15

MONDAY

Epistle Project: 1 Corinthians 16:5-11

Paul had developed exact plans for his travel. Exact plans for his mission. Exact plans for where he would go, what he would do there, who he would see, and how long he would stay. Paul believed in God's sovereignty over everything, as is reflected in his caveat statement, "if the Lord permits." However, his trust in God's control did not make him a passive man, but rather, his knowledge that the Lord rules and reigns over all things gave him a passion to think carefully, plan diligently, and strategize wisely for the advance of the gospel. May we too be people who plan diligently and strategize wisely for the advance of the gospel.

TUESDAY

Epistle Project: 1 Corinthians 16:12-18

If you were asked to write out a list of things that you think make up a good church, what would it say? Perhaps your list would include something about the music, the parking, the preaching, the types of people in attendance, the children's ministry, etc. Surely your list would have many important things on it, but here in Paul's final instructions to the church in Corinth we see an echo of the two greatest commandments (Matt. 22:36-40); "Let all that you do be done in love," (v. 14). Any church that aims to be a faithful church must be one that takes this command seriously. Pray that God would help us to be a church in which all that we do is done in love.

WEDNESDAY

Epistle Project: 1 Corinthians 16:19-24

In this passage, the Apostle Paul sends greetings to the church at Corinth from other believers. “The churches of Asia send you greetings. Aquila and Prisca, together with the church in their house, send you hearty greetings in the Lord. All the brothers send you greetings. Greet one another with a holy kiss,” (vv. 19-20). This is a beautiful picture of Christians loving other Christians, especially those who are from different churches. Pray and ask the Lord to give you a greater love for other Christians, both in our own church and in other churches all over the world.

FRIDAY

Epistle Project: 2 Corinthians 1:12-2:4

It is not uncommon for Christians to struggle with the assurance of their faith. Often times these struggles come as one looks at his or her failures in life, and that’s exactly where the problem begins. We must remember that we are not responsible for our salvation. We did not secure it, and we cannot undo it. It is God who establishes the one who repents of his or her sin and trusts in Christ. God puts His seal on us and gives us His Spirit as our guarantee. The next time you wonder about your salvation, ask yourself who your eyes are fixed on.

THURSDAY

Epistle Project: 2 Corinthians 1:1-11

When the scripture says in 2 Cor 1:3-4, “Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of mercies and God of all comfort, who comforts us in all our affliction, so that we may be able to comfort those who are in any affliction, with the comfort with which we ourselves are comforted by God,” we ought to say, “How have I been afflicted in my life? What trials have I gone through? What ways have I suffered or been abused?” And upon the answer to that question, we ought to ask, “Who is going through that now that I can help? How can I show them the same comfort I found in God?” Whether it is marriage struggles, parenting issues, past abuse, medical trials, or anything else, the Lord wants to use you in the lives of those who are going through now what you’ve been through before. Show them the comfort you received from Him.

SATURDAY

Epistle Project: Catch Up Day

Take time to reflect on the last few weeks of your time reading through 1 Corinthians. Pray and thank the Lord for what He has taught you and ask Him to provide a greater understanding of 2 Corinthians as you read through it.
