

MONDAY

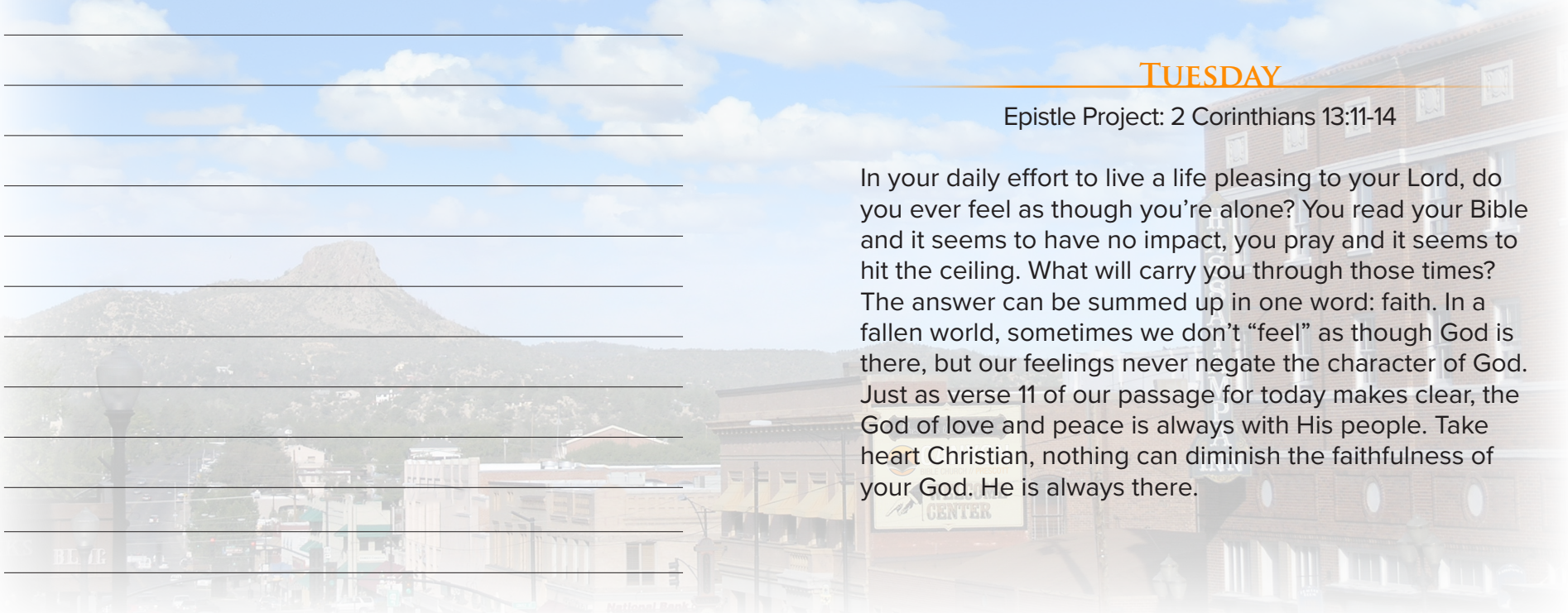
Epistle Project: 2 Corinthians 13:1-10

As we read 2 Corinthians 13:1-10, we see that Paul is serious about sin in the church. He has already given several warnings to those in sin, and now warns them again, going further to say that unrepentant sin is a reason to question if you are truly saved. He says, “Examine yourselves, to see whether you are in the faith. Test yourselves. Or do you not realize this about yourselves, that Jesus Christ is in you?— unless indeed you fail to meet the test!” Paul isn’t saying this to be harsh, but because of his love for them. He even says, “Your restoration is what we pray for.” When we see sin as the dangerous killer that it is, we will not make light of it, tolerate it, or treat it casually. There are times we must be ready to say hard things to people we love. We must say them with grace and compassion, but we must say them.

TUESDAY

Epistle Project: 2 Corinthians 13:11-14

In your daily effort to live a life pleasing to your Lord, do you ever feel as though you’re alone? You read your Bible and it seems to have no impact, you pray and it seems to hit the ceiling. What will carry you through those times? The answer can be summed up in one word: faith. In a fallen world, sometimes we don’t “feel” as though God is there, but our feelings never negate the character of God. Just as verse 11 of our passage for today makes clear, the God of love and peace is always with His people. Take heart Christian, nothing can diminish the faithfulness of your God. He is always there.



WEDNESDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 1:1-5

As with other greetings in Paul's letters, there are familiar elements here, specifically that of grace and peace. Paul wishes his audience grace, which is God's unmerited favor, and peace, God's blessing of well-being. He greets his readers this way before rebuking them in verses 6-9. Paul shows loving care when confronting others. Pray and ask the Lord to help you show the same loving care when the time comes when you have to confront another.

FRIDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 1:11-24

In this passage Paul speaks of the gospel not being "man's gospel." If it were, then it would be human in origin and therefore works based centered on man's pride. The gospel that Paul preached was not human in origin, but divine in its origin. Paul preached the "gospel of Christ," (Gal. 1:7). This gospel of Christ is salvation by grace alone through faith alone in Christ alone and is certainly good news! Pray and praise the Lord for the one true gospel, the gospel of Christ.

THURSDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 1:6-10

No other letter to the churches in the New Testament begins with an absence of commendation and a stronger warning than Galatians: "I am astonished that you are so quickly deserting him who called you in the grace of Christ and are turning to a different gospel— not that there is another one, but there are some who trouble you and want to distort the gospel of Christ." A distorted gospel is a damning gospel. An adjusted gospel is an abandoned gospel. A modified gospel is a malicious gospel. A revised gospel is a reversed gospel. Nothing can be added. Nothing can be taken away. This is why we must be absolutely certain that our understanding of the gospel comes directly from God through his word. Not through any man or teacher or ministry, but directly from the Word of God. And then let us cherish and treasure this precious gospel.

SATURDAY

Epistle Project: Catch Up Day

Take time today to praise the Lord for His word and your study through it. Ask Him to continue to give you a greater understanding of Scripture and ask Him to help to correctly apply it in your life.
