Epistle Project: Ephesians 3:14-21

Paul wants the Christians in Ephesus to be "rooted and grounded in love." So, he wants them to have the "strength to comprehend" the love of Christ for them. He wants them to comprehend it "with all the saints," and the great irony of this is that he says this very love of Christ "surpasses knowledge." He wants them to understand and know "the breadth and length and height and depth" of the love of Christ, and yet, he says it "surpasses knowledge." This is one of the great paradoxes of the Christian life: as believers, we are continually learning something which is not fully learnable. We are continually growing towards something which is not fully achievable. We will never be able to fully know the love of Christ — it surpasses knowledge — and yet we have the great privilege in growing in our knowledge of it day by day. As we do, may we be rooted and grounded in love, constantly giving ourselves to love those around us.

Epistle Project: Ephesians 4:1-16

By God's grace our 3-year-old church seems to be a healthy and vibrant group. We certainly would not say that we're perfect, but overall, we are seeing the Lord work in and through us. What is the key to maintaining this environment? The answer is faithfulness. In God's equation, success always equals faithfulness to Him and His Word. Epistle Project: Ephesians 4:17-32

Epistle Project: Ephesians 5:22-33

In verses 25-32 Paul gives practical examples of how the members of the church build up Christ's body. Paul shows us how we are to live edifying lifestyles. Read these verses again and ask that the Lord would make these things, the things which build up the body of Christ, evident in your life.

It's not uncommon for couples who have been married for many years to get asked the question, "What's the key to a good marriage?" It's a good question really and it's especially one that Christians should be thinking about. But there's a better question to ask, and that is, "What's the key to a godly marriage?" That is the question that we see answered in today's passage. When God wants us to think about marriage, He wants us to think about the gospel. Wives are to display the church's submission to our Lord and husbands are to display our Lord's love for His church. Marriage, you see, is not actually about the people who are in it but is about the Lord who ordained it. So, wives, does your submission to your husband preach to the world that Jesus is the head of His church? Husbands, does the way you show love to your wife preach to the world that Jesus sacrificially laid His life down on behalf of His church? You can read all the marriage books in the world and gain all the practical tips that people have to offer, but if you miss this you miss the whole point.

THURSDAY

Epistle Project: Ephesians 5:1-21

The Christian life is a life of imitation. Yes, we imitate those who disciple us and lead us, but even this is, as Paul said to the Corinthians, a following our leaders as they follow Christ (1 Cor 10:1). We imitate God. Paul tells the Ephesians, "Be imitators of God, as beloved Children, and walk in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us." A small boy looks up to his father as he shaves or ties his tie, and soon the boy is found looking at himself in the mirror, imitating his father. In the same way, we look up to Jesus and imitate him. However, what we imitate in him, according to Paul, is this: "Christ loved us and gave himself up for us." Jesus our King died for us. He gave himself up for us. And we are called to imitate this action, giving up ourselves for those around us. Dying — in a sense for them. Dying to our preferences and desires, dying to our ways and our time, and doing it for them. In this way, we imitate our heavenly father as we imitate his son. To love is to imitate Christ and give ourselves up for others.
