you dried up ever-flowing streams.

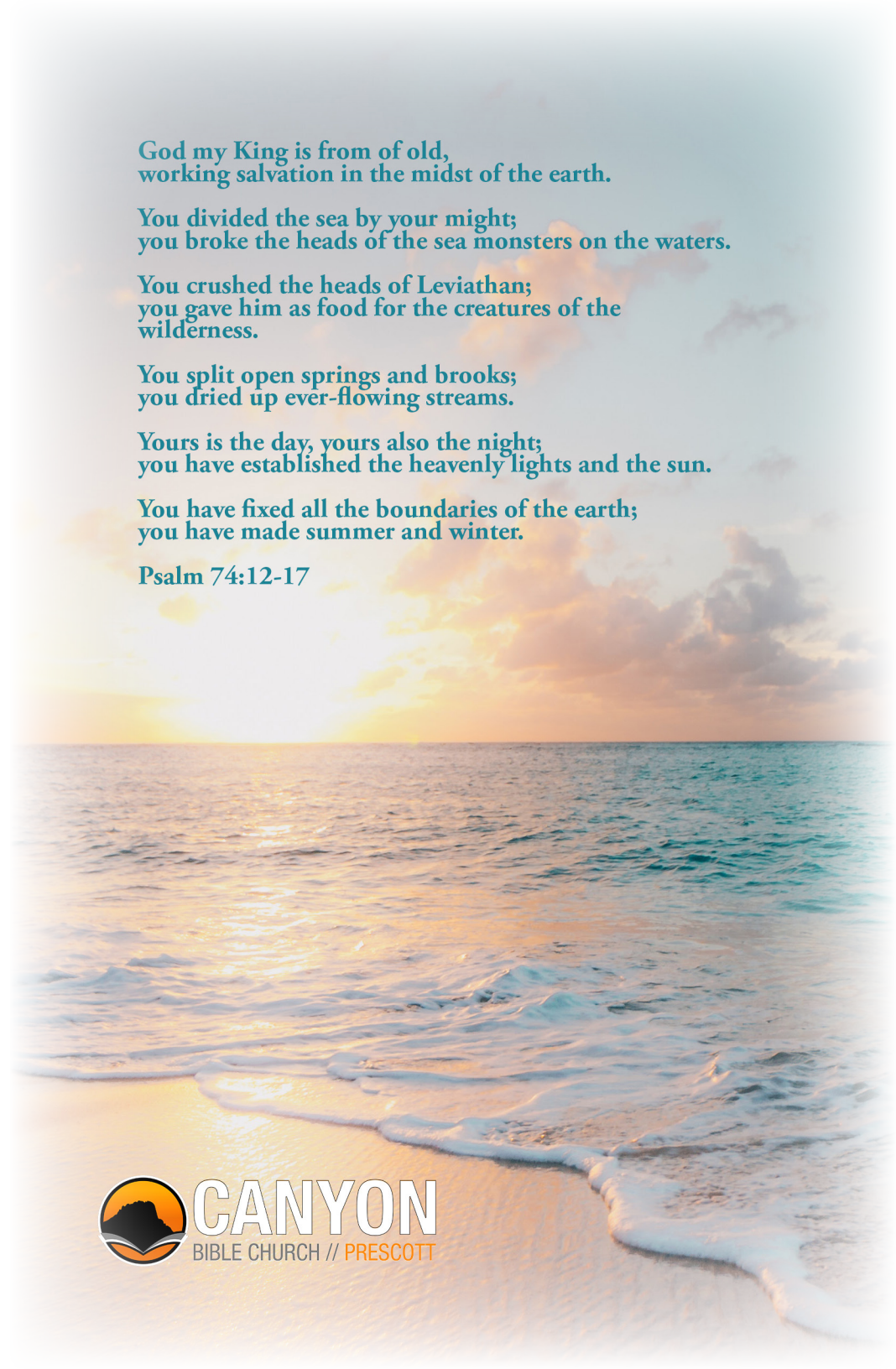

## WEDNESDAY

Epistle Project: Ephesians 6:10-20

The Christian life is one of difficulty. If we're not careful, we can be tempted to think that it's too difficult. God, however, does not leave us without the resources we need to live a faithful, victorious Christian life. When someone serves in the military, they are issued all the gear that they need to do their jobs. In the same way, God gives us armor for the battle, so that we can stand strong. The difference, though, is that our battles are fought through prayer and not by taking up arms. Rejoice dear Christian, you're God has given you all that you need. Make sure you're utilizing all your resources.

## FRIDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 1:1-11

As believers we can have full confidence that the God who saved us will never let us go. God's faithfulness ensures us that He will be with believers until Jesus returns. We can be sure of this because it was God who "began a good work" in us and "will bring it to completion at the day of Jesus Christ," (v. 6). As a Christian, any spiritual progress we make, is rooted in what God has done, is doing, and will do. Pray and thank the Lord for what He has done, is doing and will do in your life. Ask Him to give you greater confidence to know and trust that He is with you and will never let you go.

## THURSDAY

Epistle Project: Ephesians 6:21-24

"Peace be to the brothers, and love with faith, from God the Father and the Lord Jesus Christ. Grace be with all who love our Lord Jesus Christ with love incorruptible." Ephesians 6:23-24 is a beautiful benediction. In this Paul reminds believers of our love for Christ that is "incorruptible." This is a love that only belongs to those who truly believe. This is a love that is not temporary but is a permanent and genuine love. Believers love the Lord Jesus Christ in this way because He first loved us (1 John 4:19). In fact, God's love was made manifest in Christ (1 John 4:9). Read 1 John 4:7-21 praising God for His love for us. Also, pray and ask the Lord to help you fulfill the "commandment we have from him: whoever loves God must also love his brother," (1 John 4:21), so that we might show God's love by loving others.

## SATURDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 1:12-18

Imagine yourself imprisoned, chained, and writing a letter to your church. What would that letter say? Now read today's passage and see what Paul's letter from prison said. You may read it and ask, "How could Paul have that mindset in his situation?" The answer is simple; he had a singular life-focus of making Jesus Christ known. His circumstances couldn't get him down because his joy was not tied to them. Instead, it was tied to the proclamation of Jesus Christ. When we find ourselves asking questions like the above, it should tell us that we have other aims in life than making Christ known. Ask God to help you get rid of those other aims and make Jesus your only focus.
