THINKING BIBLICALLY ABOUT TRANSGENDERISM

MONDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 4:1-7

The imagery of adoption used by Paul in verse 5 picks up the Old Testament concept of God calling Israel “son”. He combines this with the Roman notion of adopting a son, which was usually already a grown man. This was done to designate him as an heir to the family wealth. When a person is redeemed and adopted by God, “they are no longer a slave, but a son, and if a son, then an heir through God,” (v. 7). As a believer pray and praise the Lord for His adoption of you knowing that you are a child of God.

TUESDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 4:8-20

Imagine a scenario in which you find out that someone you know and love dearly has traded in the true gospel for one that teaches them that they must add their own work to Jesus' in order to be saved. How would this make you feel? That is precisely the situation that the Apostle Paul found himself to be in when dealing with the churches of Galatia, and what we see in today's passage is that he felt an overwhelming sense of anguish on their behalf. It was not anger toward them, but compassion that was kindled in Paul. Today it seems that far too many Christians get angry at those who go astray, rather than having a broken-hearted compassion for them. Ask the Lord to help you, and all His people, respond to others with this type of compassion.

WEDNESDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 4:21-31

In this passage Paul uses an Old Testament example to show the difference between being a free child of God and being a slave to the law and to sin. This is contrasted in Abraham's sons from Hagar and Sarah. Being a child of God means that we have been set free from sin and therefore are no longer a slave to sin but a slave of righteousness (Rom. 6:18). Take time to thank the Lord for what He has done in setting you free from being a slave to sin.

FRIDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 5:16-26

According to today's passage, it is blatantly obvious who is a Christian and who is not. Who is the difference maker? The Holy Spirit who lives inside of us. Paul presents two options for our walks, two lists describing what each of them will look like, and then declares the glorious truth that because of our faith in Christ, Christians have crucified their flesh and now live by the Spirit. The internal realities of our salvation then work themselves out in our everyday lives as we walk not according to our old, dead flesh, but according to the Spirit. Is this difference evident in your life? Ask God to make it more so each day.

THURSDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 5:1-15

At the beginning of this passage Paul writes, "For freedom Christ has set us free." This is freedom from the Jewish ceremonial laws and regulations, but not from obedience from God's moral standards. Pray and praise God for this freedom and ask Him to help you in greater obedience to His moral standard.

SATURDAY

Epistle Project: Galatians 6:1-10

Christ, "who gave himself for our sins to deliver us from the present evil age, according to the will of our God and Father," (Gal. 1:4), is the ultimate burden-bearer. To bear one another's burdens is to imitate Jesus. Although each believer "will have to bear his own load" (Gal. 6:5), we still have to be faithful in our own responsibilities; however, there are times when they need help from others. Pray and ask the Lord for opportunities to help bear the burdens of others. Ask this so that you can give glory to God and be a blessing to others.
