MONDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 1:19-30

"To live is Christ, and to die is gain." To live is equivalent to serving Christ. To die is to be seen as gain. This is because it will mean being freed from life on earth to being in Christ's presence. Although the Christian looks forward, to when they will be in Christ's presence, they must not neglect in serving Him before then. Pray and ask the Lord to help you "to live as Christ" and to be increasing every day in your service to Him.

TUESDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 2:1-11

As Christians, we desire to live Christ-like lives. In fact, Christians are always talking about how to live for the Lord. This passage gives us the recipe on how to do that. The key is to "count others more significant than ourselves," and to look to the interests of others. Naturally, we are selfish creatures, but God has called Christians to lay down their lives daily. This means that the Christian's new disposition is not one of self-centeredness, but one of others-centeredness. This, in fact, is exactly how Jesus lived. Ask God to help you identify areas of selfishness in your life and for the help to put them to death, so that you can live as your Lord wants you to.

Epistle Project: Philippians 2:12-18

Epistle Project: Philippians 3:1-11

In this passage Paul tells his readers to "work out your own salvation with fear and trembling." To "work out" here means to be continuously working in an effort to bring something about to completion. Our faith is to be demonstration day by day. This is possible through God's empowering presence because "it is God who works in you." Pray and thank the Lord for His empowering presence in your life. Ask Him to help you live in such a way that your faith, in Him, is always on display.

What is the most prized possession that you own? What is the greatest accomplishment that you have ever achieved? In God's grace, He gives us good gifts and great opportunities to do some amazing things in life. There's nothing wrong with these things - except, of course, if you find your worth in them. What Paul teaches us in this passage is that knowing Jesus Christ and being found righteous through faith in Him is the single most valuable gift anyone can ever experience. When we value Him and His salvation most, then sacrifice of anything else comes naturally to us. Dear Christian, see Jesus Christ for all that He is. See knowing Him as the most valuable prize you can ever attain.

THURSDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 2:19-30

In this passage Paul highlights Timothy's life as being service-centered. This is to be an example to us. This also highlights the very personal nature of early church life. Timothy was "genuinely concerned" for the welfare of the Philippian church. In this Timothy was emulating Christ. We too should seek to emulate Timothy, as he emulated Christ, and have a concern for the life of the church. Pray and ask the Lord to burden your heart to serve others and seek to build up the body of Christ (Eph. 4:12).

SATURDAY

Epistle Project: Philippians 3:12-4:1

"Therefore, my brothers, whom I love and long for, my joy and crown, stand firm thus in the Lord, my beloved," (Phil 4:1). To "stand firm" is a military term that would describe a soldier at his post. As Christians we are commanded to "stand firm." Pray and ask the Lord to help you to be one who stands firm "in the Lord," to be one who stands firm for the Lord.
