Prophet Project: Amos 8:1-14

In today's passage, Amos is describing the final end of Israel and is doing so by using powerful imagery. We read of dead bodies thrown everywhere that there will be silence; those who are needy will be trampled and face a terrible end. When we consider passages like this it ought to impress upon us the need to preach the gospel in this dark world. Those who die without Christ will face the most terrible end. As you pray for opportunities to evangelize, also pray for the short term missions team in Ireland this week. They will be going out to schools, retirement communities, and the homes neighboring the church. Pray that hearts would turn from sin to trust in Christ, not only here in our community, but in Ireland and every nation.

Prophet Project: Amos 9:1-10

Today's passage is sobering and terrifying. The language the Holy Spirit uses here is difficult as He highlights the sin of God's chosen people. Amos hears the LORD describe the lengths He will go to punish the sin of the Israelites. The LORD will chase after these people, and nothing will stop Him. "If they dig into Sheol, from there shall my hand take them...If they hide themselves on the top of Carmel, from there I will search them out and take them...And if they go into captivity before their enemies, there I will command the sword, and it shall kill them." Is this language troublesome or difficult to read? These words make sense only to the degree to which we clearly see God. If our sin isn't important or small, we will rightly be appalled by what we read. But if we rightly see sin for what it is, we will understand the depth of God's anger against such behavior. Do you see sin clearly against God or is it something on a horizontal plane that is compared to others? Turn from sin today because God "is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance" (1 Pet 3:9)

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Amos 9:11-15

“I will plant them on their land, and they shall never again be uprooted out of the land that I have given them,” says the Lord your God” (Amos 9:15). This blessing of the people is based on their recognition of their Davidic messiah. When we consider this we see that this recognition has not yet occurred. Romans 11:25-27 states: “Lest you be wise in your own sight, I do not want you to be unaware of this mystery, brothers: a partial hardening has come upon Israel, until the fullness of the Gentiles has come in. And in this way all Israel will be saved, as it is written, ‘The Deliverer will come from Zion, he will banish ungodliness from Jacob’; ‘and this will be my covenant with them when I take away their sins.’”

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Obadiah 1-14

“The pride of your heart has deceived you, you who live in the clefts of the rock, in your lofty dwelling, who say in your heart, “Who will bring me down to the ground?” (v. 3). Quite the sobering statement. The prophet is addressing Edom which was despised by the nations. The nation’s pride is being put on display and the fact that Edom will be humbled. James 4:6 says: “But he gives more grace. Therefore it says, “God opposes the proud but gives grace to the humble.” Pray and ask the Lord to reveal all pride that has crept into your heart. Ask the Lord to remove the pride and to humble your heart.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Obadiah 15-21

Today’s passage speaks of God’s justice as a comfort to his people. Edom had been Israel’s enemy for many years. They constantly harassed and attacked God’s people. The Edomites were proud because they had accumulated great wealth and because they had a position that provided a great deal of protection (v.3). However, God’s message to them was simple. “Though you soar aloft like the eagle, though your nest is set among the stars, from there I will bring you down” (v.4). Many people in our time seem to boast or have pride in their wealth and position instead of trusting in God. This passage should warn them but comfort God’s people. He is the ultimate judge, and we know the ultimate end of those who trust in anything other than God. So, the question for us is simple: is our trust in wealth or in God?

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Jonah 1:1-6

Jonah was given a call by the Lord to go to Nineveh and to “call out against it, for their evil has come before me” (v. 1). Instead Jonah sought to flee from the presence of the Lord. We may tend to think that we can flee from the Lord to somehow escape Him. We might think that since no one else is around when we sin, that means that God does not know about it. All of this could not be further from the truth, and we know it. When you feel that you might want to flee from the Lord, stop! Instead of fleeing from the Lord, seek the Lord knowing that He is a loving Father who cares for you.
