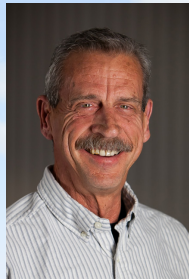

1 Samuel 23:1-18

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Micah 3:1-12

The language in this passage is intense and graphic. We might look at a passage like this and think of just how horrible those people must have been because of their sin. But are we any better? Read Matthew 5:12-26. We are just as liable for the sin in our hearts. Pray and ask the Lord to reveal deep-rooted sin in your life. Ask for forgiveness, and seek repentance.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Micah 4:1-13

Today's passage takes a dramatic turn. Micah shifts from pronouncing judgment on Israel's leadership to pronouncing a future time of blessing. He speaks of a time when all nation will come to worship the Lord (v.2), weapons of war will be useless (v.3), and bountiful blessings (v.4). God's people would be taken into captivity as punishment for their disobedience. But even in light of judgment, God gave them hope of a day when everything would function as it was intended to. We may not be facing captivity, but we are facing a world broken by sin. Be encouraged, knowing that God will orient all things to himself one day.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Micah 5:1-15

Although much could be said about this passage, verse 3 stands out: “Therefore he shall give them up until the time when she who is in labor has given birth; then the rest of his brothers shall return to the people of Israel.”

The part, which stands out is “the rest of his brothers shall return.” This emphasizes that the people of God, under the Messiah’s rule, will be unified. Truly this is something to be excited about. All of God’s people will be united under the Messiah’s rule. It is hard for us to imagine being completely united with everyone around us, but one day this will happen and all because of Christ.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Micah 7:1-20

So far, in the book of Micah we have seen repeated themes of sin, judgment, and a future promise of blessing from God. As this book ends, we can see the heart of a prophet pleading to God on behalf of his people. Micah starts with confession and lamentation over the sins of his people (vv. 1-6). However, considering the state of sin and the impending judgment drives him to hope in God (v. 7) and look towards the day when God will once again shepherd his flock (v.14). Micah ends his lament with renewed passion and praise for God. We are right to lament the sin we see in and around us. But don’t stop there. Renew your trust in his goodness and confidence in his character.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Micah 6:1-16

“He has told you, O man, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?” (Micah 6:8). This single verse packs so much for us. It is easy to say that we love kindness and that we walk humbly with God, but do we? Ask the Lord to reveal areas of your heart where you have not been kind. Ask the Lord to humble your heart so that you can seek the humility to be more like Christ.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Nahum 1:1-15

Much of this passage (vv. 2-8) is a praise to the Lord, which describes Him as He has been and how He will be throughout history. Nahum is establishing and defining God’s power and omnipotence. Nahum is also describing God as holy, one who will punish the wicked and will avenge His own. The passage then speaks (vv. 9-15) to the Lord’s coming judgment on Nineveh and the deliverance of Judah. The Lord is a jealous God and an avenging God and is just in being so because He is a holy God. No one can stand before His wrath. Without Christ, we would not be able to either.
