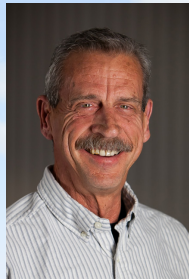

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 2:6-20

Amidst this passage of judgment on the Chaldeans, there is a shining beacon of hope for God's people. Verse 14 reminds us that one day "The earth will be filled with the knowledge of the glory of the LORD as the waters cover the sea." Since the sea is water, "as the waters cover the sea" simply means completely and totally. "The knowledge of the glory of the LORD" will be ubiquitous. One day there will be nobody on earth who does not know God. This is a picture of hope in the midst of a world now filled with evil.

## TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 3:1-16

In today's passage, we see the change Habakkuk experienced after he spoke with God. God answered Habakkuk's questions with a panoramic view of the future. Yes, the Babylonians would be God's instrument to punish His people. But their end would be destruction. Habakkuk gives the entire chapter to praise God for who he is. Habakkuk recounts God's appearance (v.3-7), God's actions in nature (v.8-11), and His actions among the nations (v. 12-15). Whether we are struggling temptation to sin or the effects of sin, our response should be like Habakkuk. Turn from your circumstance and praise God for who he is. Trust that He is in control over the things we face and wait patiently on His goodness.



## WEDNESDAY

### Prophet Project: Habakkuk 3:17-19

The change in Habakkuk, from the beginning of this book to the end, is dramatic. He starts by trying to inform God on how to run His world. Habakkuk ends with trusting that God knows what is best. The same can be true of us at times. We think we know better, but by the end of the trial or situation, we are shown that God always knows what is best. The problem is the next time something comes up, we can sometimes forget what we've learned. Take time to remember all the times you thought of how things should go, but how God did what was best. Pray and ask the Lord to bring this to remembrance when needed. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to trust that His ways are always best.

## FRIDAY

### Prophet Project: Zephaniah 2:1-15

Today's passage continues the author's theme of judgment for anyone who disobeys or turns from God. Zephaniah pronounces judgment on the surrounding nations for their idolatry (v.4–15) because God is the God of all nations, not just Judah. But the interesting portion of today's passage is found in the opening verses. Mingled with warning of judgment is a sincere call to repent—to turn from sin and turn to God. Spend time meditating on the fact that God is truly slow to anger and abounding in steadfast love. Even in the face of sin God lovingly calls all to repent. Repent of sin today and seek the Lord (v.3).

## THURSDAY

### Prophet Project: Zephaniah 1:1-18

Sometimes, right in the middle of a passage of judgment, we find a sharp reminder that ought to strike sobriety into our hearts. In verse 12, we see this statement of coming judgment: "I will punish the men who are complacent, those who say in their hearts, 'The LORD will not do good, nor will he do ill.'" One of the characteristics of those who will be judged is complacency. Lack of zeal for God. Apathy towards the things of the Lord. May we be people who guard ourselves against complacency by daily walking in nearness to Jesus Christ.

## SATURDAY

### Prophet Project: Zephaniah 3:1-8

In today's passage, we learn that God's people, Jerusalem, cannot think that they will come away unscathed on the day of the Lord. If they sin, they are held accountable, especially if they lack repentance. This passage reminds us that the Christian will stand before Him in judgment. The Christian will not face God's wrath because of Christ, but will still give an account (Romans 14:12). Pray and ask the Lord to reveal sin in your life so that you can confess and repent. Ask Him to help you to make confession and repentance a more active part of your life.
