FOLLOW THE SON OF MAN IN PRAYER

Luke 11:1-13

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Nahum 2:1-13

Today's passage focuses on Nineveh and the Lord's coming judgment. The account reads like an eyewitness account of the attack on the city, which is overrun by the enemy. Nahum writes as if he were there telling Nineveh to prepare for battle. Consider the seriousness and significance of this passage and how the Lord speaks of judgment (v. 13). As you read through Scripture, whether in the Old or New Testament, it is not to be taken lightly. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to have a greater understanding of the significance of His Word.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Nahum 3:1-19

Today's passage is a continuing pronouncement on Assyria. We see again the cruelty of the Assyrians and the reasons that they will be judged by God. These prophecies may seem harsh at first glance. Nahum predicts that there will be dead bodies without end (v.3), fire devouring the city (v.15), and people being scattered on the mountains (v.18). But this oracle would have been received with great joy and comfort as seen in the last verse, "All who hear the news about you clap their hands over you." Those who seemed invincible would be judged because of their merciless treatment of other nations. We can share in the comfort from this oracle knowing that God will judge all wrongs one day.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 1:1-4

Habakkuk is lamenting as he believes that God is letting sin go unpunished, and because of this there is no justice. We see Habakkuk give a type of formal complaint when he asks “how long?” At times we can see sin in the world, which seems to go unpunished. In our hearts we complain, like Habakkuk, how long Lord until you deal with it? Our time would be better served by remembering that God is patient. 2 Peter 3:9: “The Lord is not slow to fulfill his promise as some count slowness, but is patient toward you, not wishing that any should perish, but that all should reach repentance.” Pray and praise God for His patience toward you and also that He is patient with others so that “all should reach repentance.”

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 1:12-2:1

If Habakkuk’s first appeal to God was a plea for justice, then today’s passage would be questioning the type of justice God would give. It is as if Habakkuk is saying, “I know I asked for justice, but how can this be justice?” Habakkuk couldn’t understand how God could use a people who were more wicked than the Israelites to accomplish his will (v.13). The Chaldeans were merciless (v.15) and idolatrous (v.16). God can and will use anything he chooses to punish and correct sin. Our response should not be to question the “fairness” of his punishment. Rather, we must rest in His wisdom and goodness as He seeks to punish sin and make us more like his son.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 1:5-11

In the first four verses in Habakkuk, we read of his complaint as he laments how long will the Lord wait to punish sin. Immediately after, in today’s passage, we read of the Lord’s response. The response is that the Babylonians are coming to punish the Israelites. Although we should be patient, knowing that the Lord will deal with sin, we should also not be shocked when He does, especially in our own lives. There are times when the Lord is patient with us in dealing with our sin. There are others when the Lord is quick to discipline us for our sins. Remember that when you receive just discipline, because of your sin, it is because your heavenly Father loves you. Praise the Lord for the love He has for His children.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Habakkuk 2:2-5

“But the righteous shall live by his faith” (v. 4). This verse, quoted in the New Testament, is meant to emphasize we are saved by grace through faith, but also that Christians should live by faith. The Christian knows this, but do not always live it out. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to live by faith.
