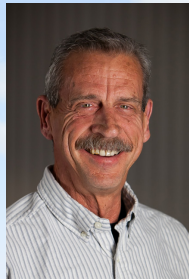

## 1 Peter 4:12-19

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Zechariah 5:1-4

The first vision, described in today's passage, is of a large scroll flying in midair. The size of the scroll is approximately 30 by 15 feet. The suggestion here is that the scroll is unrolled so that the contents can be read. The scroll is a covenant document with the task of bringing covenant curses on those who break the covenant: "Everyone who steals," "everyone who swears falsely" will "be cleaned out." Those who break the covenant will "be cleaned out." God is serious when it comes to sin, He never takes it lightly and neither should we. Today the Christian's salvation is secure in Christ, but that doesn't mean we can sin without consequence. Constantly seek to confess and repent of your sin and ask the Lord to keep you from temptation.

## TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Zechariah 5:5-11

“Wickedness” is used in verse eight, and it is a comprehensive term that represents all kinds of sin. The sin could be religious sin or social sin. Some times we might only think of this term in regards to the wickedness of the world around us. However, we must remember that the sin of the saved Christian is also wickedness. Considering this, think long and hard about your sin, and be thankful to Christ who died for you.



## WEDNESDAY

### Prophet Project: Zechariah 6:1-15

The chariots, in this vision, represent the “four winds of heaven” (v. 5). The emphases here are that there is a universality on their range; in other words, there is no place they cannot reach. In this passage the Hebrew word for wind is the same for spirit, which indicates to us that the winds also represent the agency of divine power at work. When God works there is no place that He cannot reach. God is not limited, as we are, and we must not think otherwise.

## FRIDAY

### Prophet Project: Zechariah 8:1-23

In the time ahead, Jerusalem will become the “faithful city” and Zion would again be the “holy mountain.” Here we see God renewing His presence and reaffirming His purpose with His people. However, for God’s returning to the land to be a blessing, the people must also be transformed. For such a transformation to take place is something only the Creator of the universe can do, and He does so often. True heart transformation can only take place as a result of the indwelling Spirit in the believer. Praise the Lord for the transformation that has taken place in your life as a result of His work.

## THURSDAY

### Prophet Project: Zechariah 7:1-14

Zechariah is emphasizing, like prophets who came before, that rituals are empty without obedience and justice. In other words we can say a lot and do a lot, but if you are not obeying from the heart then it means nothing to God. We might say and do the right things, but when it’s for show or to make us look good then there is no real value in it. Knowing this reminds us of our need for humility and not personal glory. Ask the Lord for humility. Ask Him to humble your heart so that your actions would give Him glory.

## SATURDAY

### Prophet Project: Zechariah 9:1-17

Zechariah tells Judah that God will bring judgment on those who oppress His people. Their circumstances are only temporary, as God will bring forth the promised king. The king will rule Israel and the nations bringing peace. “Rejoice greatly, O daughter of Zion! Shout aloud, O daughter of Jerusalem! Behold, your king is coming to you; righteous and having salvation is he, humble and mounted on a donkey, on a colt, the foal of a donkey” (v. 9). Does this sound familiar? This verse is quoted in both Matthew 21:5 and John 12:15. What a privilege we have to read of this in Zechariah and also to be able to read of the fulfillment in the New Testament.
