MONDAY

Prophet Project: Malachi 1:1-5

As the Lord tells Israel in this passage of his love for them, they look at their circumstances and question his love. God reaffirms his love by rehearsing his election of Israel through Jacob and promises to Israel. He declares that he will not allow the enemies of Israel to rebuild, but that he will one day restore Israel, and the people will see it and declare "Great is the Lord beyond the border of Israel." As Christians, we can identify with Israel in the struggle to sometimes doubt God's love when we become overly focused on our discomforting circumstances. May we be a people who are quick to come back to the Word of God, reminding ourselves of God's electing love for us and faithfulness to keep his promises.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Malachi 1:6-14

Today's passage continues a structure in which Malachi introduces a message, characterizes the people as questioning his message, and offers proof of his original message. Malachi introduces the charge of disrespecting God in verse 6a. Malachi characterizes them as questioning the validity of this charge in verse 6b. This is followed by a lengthy section where Malachi proves that they have "despised" the Lord's name in verses 8–14. God's chosen people had intentionally sinned and sought to deny this sin when confronted by God's messenger. So, the question for you centers on your response to sin when confronted. Do you justify or deny your sin when confronted by God's standard? "Entreat the favor of God that He may be gracious to you" (v.9).

Wednesday Friday

Prophet Project: Malachi 2:1-9

The priests failed to give honor to the Lord's name. They failed to guard the purity of the temple. The result is that the Lord disqualified them for service at the altar. The point is that it was their business to honor God, but instead, there was misconduct. It is our purpose, our business, to honor God. Is there sin in your life that keeps you from honoring God? Pray and ask the Lord to reveal this sin so that you can confess and repent of that sin. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to give greater honor to Him because He is deserving.

Prophet Project: Malachi 2:17-3:5

God's chosen people had "wearied" the Lord. In today's passage, we see that they had aspired false attributes to God. The Israelites couldn't resolve the tension regarding the prosperity of those who did evil or the lack of justice for those who broke the law. They resolved this tension by charging God with indifference. God didn't care about those who were suffering, and He didn't care about justice. How do you respond when what you feel or experience doesn't line up with the character of God? Do you explain your experience by charging God with indifference? Or do you trust God in the midst of your experience?

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Malachi 2:10-16

Again we see another passage where the Lord expresses his displeasure with those who are unfaithful to their marriage vows. Though the context and people to whom he was speaking are far removed from our day and time, God's priorities for marriage haven't changed. A passage like this is a great opportunity for those of us who are married to dad slowly, taking our heart through the text and asking the Lord to reveal any ways that our hearts have wandered from our spouse.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Malachi 3:6-15

Our faith and hope are based on the aspect of God's character that He does not change. "For I the Lord do not change" (v. 6a). The implication here is that God's character and eternal purposes do not change. It is because He does not change that we can be sure of our salvation. Pray and praise God for this wonderful truth of His character.
