JESUS CALLS HIS DISCIPLES Mark 1:16-20

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 9:32-38

As you read through the narrative accounts of Jesus' life in the gospels, you will repeatedly see two types of polarized responses to his life, his teaching, and his miracles. You will also see that Jesus does not let either response deter, distract, or discourage him from his mission. Some said, "this Jesus is amazing," and some said, "this Jesus is evil." It is still this way today. Two polarized responses to Jesus' life and teaching. In his life on earth, Jesus saw both responses, and simply continued on his mission: preaching the gospel, serving people, showing compassion, sending disciples. May we be just as focused on his mission today. Regardless of what responses we see, may we continue to preach the gospel, serve people, show compassion, and send disciples.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 10:1-25

How often in Jesus' life, we see the repeated refrain: training disciples and sending disciples. He does not say it will be easy. In fact, he specifically tells them it will be difficult. "Behold, I am sending you out as sheep in the midst of wolves, so be wise as serpents and innocent as doves." As we continue to focus our lives and our ministries on training and sending disciples, may we learn much from the instructions of Jesus. And may we ask the Lord to continue to give us the wisdom and the innocence we need to carry his gospel to the ends of the earth.

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 10:26-42

Fear is a normal human response. Many of us know the fear of change, trials, and even evangelism. But Jesus is not commanding his disciples to remove fear from their lives. Rather, Jesus is reorienting fear and putting it in its proper place. Followers of Christ must not fear those who can kill only the body but fear the One who can destroy both body and soul. The fear of God is a necessary and essential part of the Christian life. Would your life look different if you feared God more than man?

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 11:20-24

The cities mentioned in this passage, Chorazin, Bethsaida, and Capernaum, were places where Jesus performed many miracles. Yet those in these cities rejected Jesus and His mission and were unrepentant. The result was that Jesus denounced those cities because of their unrepentance. Due to the lack of repentance, Jesus tells these cities, "But I tell you that it will be more tolerable on the day of judgment for the land of Sodom than for you" (v. 24). Jesus is saying that if they had witnessed His miracles, even Sodom would have repented.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 11:1-19

Today's passage begins with an unlikely opening. John the Baptist is sending his disciples to determine whether Jesus is the promised messiah. John's experience of being in prison wasn't lining up with his expectation, which, at the very least, including not being in prison. Sometimes our expectation of how life should be doesn't line up with how life actually is and this can cause us to question many aspects of our Christian life. But when those doubts come, go to God in His word for comfort that He alone can give.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 11:25-30

"Come to me," Jesus says in verse 28. This is an invitation to not just to believe Jesus and historical facts about Him, but to trust Him personally. The invitation is to all who hear. Romans 10:17 tell us that "faith comes from hearing, and hearing through the word of Christ." It is the Christian who has been called to tell the lost the good news of Christ, to preach "the word of Christ." Pray that the Lord would give you the heart to tell others about Christ. Pray for courage and boldness in speaking the good news so that others might come to know Jesus personally.
