

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 18:1-7

Cush is modern day Ethiopia and is here referred to as sending messengers. "All the in-habitants of the world" are told to pay attention to what God is doing on earth. God is waiting, and judgment will come to those who do not heed his warnings. However, there will be a day in the Messiah's kingdom when Ethiopians bring tribute to the Lord in Jeru-salem. As New Testament followers of this same God, we ought to hear the inklings of the great commission in our hearts, calling us to pray, send, and go "to every tribe and tongue and nation" to make disciples, so that "all the inhabitants of the world" would hear the gospel and bring tribute to the Lord.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 19:1-15

You don't hear much talk about idols today, but in the Old Testament they show up often. Egypt was one of the nations surrounding Judah that thought their idols had much to offer (safety, wealth, abundance, etc.), but today's passage makes clear that God would expose their worthless nature. We may not hear the term "idol" very often, but don't let that fool you into thinking they are a thing of the past. It's been said that "an idol is anything you'll sin to get or sin if you don't get." Are there any such idols lurking about in your life? Today, see the emptiness of them and the surpassing power of God. Relinquish your idol and turn to your God.

Wednesday

Prophet Project: Isaiah 19:16-25

Throughout this passage "in that day" is used multiple times. What is conveyed here, is that what Isaiah writes about, will be fulfilled. Although "that day" is undated it is an inevitable future. The Bible speaks of things that will come, but we do not know when only the Lord knows. There's great comfort in knowing that the sovereign Creator knows and is in control of everything that has happened and everything that will.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 20:1-6

It's not too often you have naked buttocks in your Bible reading plan, so this passage can be shocking at first glance. It ought to be shocking. Israel had hoped in Egypt and Cush for their safety and security, and Isaiah is prophesying that those countries will be taken away as shamed naked captives, and Israel will wonder who to hope in now. Good question. God alone is able to give our hearts rest and joy, hope and security. Anything else we trust in to give us hope and security will fail us as miserably and shamefully as the exposed buttocks of captive prisoners being dragged away. What is it you are tempted to seek hope in? Confess that to the Lord and ask him to give you eyes to see that he is your only hope. When your idols fail you, and they always will turn to the one who never disappoints.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 21:1-15

As Isaiah continues his oracles of God's judgment against the nations, we must come to realize the central truth which they contain; one day God will judge all people throughout all time. As ultimate Judge, He has both the power and the right to hold all accountable. The Bible makes clear that the only safe place from God is in God. While we read about God's devastating anger against sinners, we must also remember His relentless love for them and that Jesus makes all the difference. One day this world will come to an end, and all will stand before God, but those who are in Christ are and will be forever safe from God's wrath.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 22:1-25

In the first four verses, of today's passage, Isaiah reproaches the people when they were participating in parties instead of being repentant. They were seeking pleasures without any regard for God. This is a stark reminder for us to place our focus on God and not worldly pleasures. Pray and ask the Lord to give you a heart of repentance that seeks His things and not the fleeting pleasures of this world.
