AUTHORITY TO TEACH AND TO SILENCE Mark 1:21-28

MONDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 12:1-14

Jesus says in Matt 12:7, "If you had known what this means, 'I desire mercy, and not sacrifice,' you would not have condemned the guiltless." We should be careful about the extra-biblical rules we make for ourselves, and the ways we hold others to those rules. God does not want us to force people into external obedience to a set of rules. He cares more about internal heart transformation that external behavior modification. Let's be very careful in what expectations we place on other people.

TUESDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 12:15-37

Matthew 12:34 says, "Out of the overflow of the heart, the mouth speaks." The words that come out of your mouth are not just words. They are an expression of what is in your heart. You cannot change your external behaviors simply by trying harder or doing more. There must be a transformation of the heart before there is a transformation of the mouth. Let us be a people who go to the Word of God and trust in the Spirit of God for a transformation of our hearts that changes what comes out of our mouths.

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 12:38-50

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 13:24-35

Our passage today focuses on another interaction between Jesus and the religious elite. They asked Jesus for a sign that would prove his identity. The problem was that they had already made up their mind about Jesus. No sign would change their heart. This sentiment is echoed by many people today. Many say they would become followers of Jesus if only they could see some sort of validation proving Jesus' claims. The only sign they will get is His birth, death, resurrection, and ascension. But this is all the "proof" anyone needs.

Today's passage consists of parables spoken by Jesus. There was a purpose behind Him speaking in parables. "All these things Jesus said to the crowds in parables; indeed, he said nothing to them without a parable. This was to fulfill what was spoken by the prophet: 'I will open my mouth in parables; I will utter what has been hidden since the foundation of the world'" (vv. 34-35). In speaking in parables, Jesus was fulfilling prophecy concerning Himself. This is one of many prophecies fulfilled in Christ and only in Christ. Reading passages like these ought to give us greater confidence and faith in Jesus Christ, our Savior.

THURSDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 13:1-23

Today's passage is an extended discussion of the parable of the sower. Here, Jesus tells the story about seed falling on different types of soil. Each soil produces a different quality and quantity of crop. This parable is ultimately about the different heart responses to the gospel. Instead of evaluating how others respond to the gospel, we need to evaluate our own responses to the gospel. What kind of heart do you have? Are you rejecting the gospel? Did you pray a prayer or make a decision without any real meaning in your life? By God's grace and mercy, soften your heart to the message of the gospel and respond in faith today.

SATURDAY

Gospel & Acts Project: Matthew 13:36-46

"Those who are sure they are sons of the Kingdom should hear what Jesus says here in order that their attitude toward the world might be the loving, merciful, compassionate attitude of their Lord—who has called them to witness rather than condemn, to love rather than hate, to show mercy rather than judgment. In that way we prove ourselves 'blameless and innocent, children of God above reproach in the midst of a crooked and perverse generation, among whom [we will] appear as lights in the world' (Phil 2:15)."
