THE GLORIOUS LION

Psalm 76

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 23:1-18

Consider verses 7 through 9 of today’s passage. They are speaking about the devastation of the city. The question is who could decree the downfall of such a great city? Answer: “The Lord of hosts.” It is the Lord, and He will never make peace with human pride as these people were known. Consider the pride of your own heart and repent. Seek to continually forsake pride and ask the Lord for a humble heart.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 24:1-23

Life in this fallen world is turbulent and filled with unknowns. This can lead us to worry and fear, but does God really want us to live in such a way? What is the antidote to the poison of worry and fear? It is faith. Faith in a God who will do everything He says He will including destroy this rebellious world in order to create a new one. In verse 23 of our reading today we see the definitive statement that “his glory will be before His elders,” not might be or it hopefully will be. There’s not a question in God’s mind about His ability, and this is good news for those who are tempted toward worry or fear.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 25:1-12

“O Lord, you are my God; I will exalt you; I will praise your name, for you have done wonderful things, plans formed of old, faithful and sure,” (Isaiah 25:1). This verse is one to pray back to God. As you do so remember that although redemption is worldwide in scope, redemption is personal. Also, remember “plans formed of old.” There is no last-minute attempt with God, but instead, a long assured victory. There is nothing more “faithful and sure” than God.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 26:1-21

When was the last time you were concerned about something in the future? Perhaps it was a job interview, a medical exam, or a family reunion. How did you feel walking into that unknown situation? Now, what if you had known exactly how it would turn out and that the end result was going to be amazing? Wouldn't that give you confidence? That's what we have here in today's reading - a description of the future that gives Christians an unshakable confidence to navigate life in the present. The end of the story is that Jesus wins, and so do those who are in Him. Rejoice today over your Savior's victory and hold on to it in the midst of the storm.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Catch Up Day

As you take time today to get caught up, or if you are already caught up, reflect on your time in the Prophet Project. Consider what the Lord has taught you so far in the book of Isaiah or wherever you are in your reading of Scripture. Praise Him for increased knowledge and ask Him to help you to be more than just a hearer of the word, but a doer also (James 1:22).

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Isaiah 27:1-13

The thrust of this passage is that God destroys evil and brings all of His people home. It may seem, at times, that the evil in this world is winning and that God has lost. Nothing could be further from the truth. Consider 1 Corinthians 15:57: “But thanks be to God, who gives us the victory through our Lord Jesus Christ,” and 1 John 5:4: “For everyone who has been born of God overcomes the world. And this is the victory that has overcome the world—our faith.” If you are a child of God pray and praise Him for your faith in Christ and seek every opportunity to proclaim Christ, the true Light, in this dark world.
