WHEN DOES REVIVAL HAPPEN? Psalm 85

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 8:18-9:26

In this passage, we read about Jeremiah who mourns for the people. He is mourning because they had been deceitful and as a result was self-appointed for judgment by their righteous God. Do you mourn for others when you see them being deceitful and in sin before God? Think about those in your life who are in sin and need to repent and turn to Christ, then pray fervently for them.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 10:1-25

Throughout our reading of the book of Jeremiah, we often see the theme of idolatry. While we may not see very many idol statues in our country, we certainly still wrestle with the issue. Focus in on verses 6–10 and notice the difference between the Lord and idols. Take time to thank God for delivering you from such foolishness and ask Him to expose any areas of your heart where you may be harboring idols.

Wednesday

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 11:1-23

When Jeremiah speaks of "this covenant" in verse 2, it is a reference to God's covenant, the Mosaic Law. It is summarized in the next three verses speaking of the curses, the consequences for Israel's disobedience, and blessing for their obedience. Today the believer is not under the law but under grace. This does not mean that there are no consequences for disobedience. The Apostle Paul tells us clearly that grace is not a license to sin. "What then? Are we to sin because we are not under law but under grace? By no means!" (Romans 6:15). The Christian is under grace, and their sin has been forgiven. However, there are still consequences when we are disobedient. Let us not think of grace as a means to freely sin, but rather as the reason not turn from sin and turn to God.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 12:1-17

"How long?," (Jer. 12:4). This common question is asked by those who are waiting for justice. It is not uncommon for even believers to often think that God will not judge. "Beloved, never avenge yourselves, but leave it to the wrath of God, for it is written, "Vengeance is mine, I will repay, says the Lord," (Romans 12:19). Remember that God is in control and His timing is not our timing. Pray and ask the Lord, to give you a greater sense of comfort and trust, when you are tempted to think "How long?"

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 13:1-27

FRIDAY

One of the Lord's main messages through the prophet Jeremiah was the sinfulness of His people. In this chapter, the Lord explains that He would send His people into exile because of their sin and lack of repentance, and we learn the lesson that the Lord takes sin seriously. He takes it so seriously, in fact, that He sent His own Son to die for our sin. If this is how seriously God takes sin, then we must also take it seriously. In all your efforts to glorify your Lord, do all that you can to kill sin in your life as soon as you see it.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 14:1-22

Jeremiah, giving the prophecy in this chapter, does so during a grought in Judah. Judah is in mourning because of the situation (v 2). The situation is so dire that even the prominent people, the nobles, have enough water (v 3). Jeremiah intercedes for Judah even though they had been in rebellion and sinned against God (v 7). In verses 11 and 12 we see that God will not accept intercession or religious observances, over the situation, because they are false. Take time to consider your prayers before the Lord. Have you sought after help, from the Lord, while at the same time living in unrepentant sin? Ask the Lord to reveal areas of your life where you have sinned and need to repent.
