A HEALTHY RESPONSE TO HERESY ENCOURAGES THE CHURCH Acts 15:1-31

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 2:1-3:15

In our passage for today in Ezekiel 2 and 3, we see God calling Ezekiel to spread His words to the people. While this instruction is not spoken directly to us, there is much we can learn. Since every Christian is called by God to share his words with the world, we can benefit from what God says to Ezekiel in this passage. Read over the passage a few times, meditating on the application for our evangelism and ministry.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 3:16-27

A watchman was someone whose role it was to stand on the walls of the city and be a lookout for approaching enemies in order to warn the city of danger. As the Lord called Ezekiel to his ministry amongst the captives of Judah, He wanted Ezekiel to understand that he would play that role for their spiritual lives. If he failed to warn them of the Lord's words, he would be guilty of their blood himself. This role of warning is still active today for the church of Jesus Christ. We have been commissioned to make disciples, and that means warning those who are in rebellion against God about their impending death. Pray that we would be faithful to fulfill this role.

Wednesday

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 4:1-17

Ezekiel 4:7 states, "And you shall set your face toward the siege of Jerusalem, with your arm bared, and you shall prophesy against the city." "Arm bared" is meant to symbolize a soldier who is ready for action or an outstretched arm where the Lord would act on behalf of His people. In this circumstance, it is wielded against Jerusalem. Scripture often uses symbolic language, and in this case, Ezekiel's preaching is preceding the downfall of Jerusalem. His message, his symbolism, is consistently pointing to the approaching judgment.

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 6:1-14

FRIDAY

Throughout our reading together of the Prophets, we have read much about idolatry and the Lord's hatred of it. Have you ever considered how awful it would be if the Lord did, in fact, put up with such an offense? If He simply did not care who we gave our worship to? Take some time today and thank God that He, and He alone, is the true God worthy of all worship.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 5:1-17

Reading the first four verses of Ezekiel chapter 5 might leave you pretty confused. It's almost humorously strange, and we can thank the Lord that our ministry to one another doesn't require any head shaving. As you continue to read chapter 5, the strange behavior is explained as symbolic acts of judgment on Jerusalem for their sin. In this, we can see God's hatred for sin, and we ought to be humbled by the fact that our sin is just as wicked before the Lord, and we have received grace.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Catch Up Day

Having a catch-up day, not only allows you to get caught up in the Prophet Project, but also the opportunity to reflect on what you have learned recently in your study of the prophets. Take time to pray and ask the Lord to continue to grow you through your time of reading Scripture.
