THE PURPOSE OF TRIALS 1 Peter 1:6-9

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 49:34-39

Invaders were sent, by God, against Elam to destroy it. But at the end of this passage, we read of a promise. The promise is that God would allow for the Elamites to return and thus predict future salvation for Gentiles. "But in the latter days I will restore the fortunes of Elam, declares the Lord" (Jer. 49:39). In Acts 2:9, the Elamites were among those present at Pentecost. In God's providence, He preserved this people and allowed them to return so that they might be present at Pentecost. Read Acts 2 and make a note of all the nations represented during Peter's sermon at Pentecost.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 50:1-46

In today's reading, the Lord declared His judgment upon the nation of Babylon. As a reminder, this was the nation He used to judge His people and even called King Nebuchadnezzar His servant. This pronouncement of judgment reminds us that the Lord never plays favorites. He used the nation of Babylon, but He also judged them for their pride. Let us remember that the Lord's ways are higher than ours (Isa. 55:9) and that, even when we can't understand His purposes, He always works good for His people (Rom. 8:28).

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 51:1-64

(Heb 13:5). It is because of this promise that believers can

be content, no matter the circumstance.

Jeremiah 51:4 states: "For Israel and Judah have not been forsaken by their God, the Lord of hosts, but the land of the Chaldeans is full of guilt against the Holy One of Israel." Even though there had been judgments, which God had sent on Israel and Judah, He had not forsaken them, and here they are reminded of that fact. Christians today have this same promise, "I will never leave you nor forsake you"

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 52:24-30

In this passage, we read of the people being exiled to Babylon. This occurred in four phases and the first, which occurred in 605 B.C., under Jehoiakim, and this marked the beginning of the 70 years in exile. The second occurred in 597 B.C. under Jehoiachin and the third in 586 B.C. under Zedekiah. The last was from 582-581 B.C. The exile was not one event, but multiple deportations. We know that this is not the end of the story. We know that God has a plan for His people. We may not always understand the how or the why, but our trust is in a sovereign Lord.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 52:1-23

What a sad day it must have been for the people of Judah to watch the Temple of the Lord burn, and yet the Lord had sovereignly ordained the whole thing. The Lord had sent His prophets to call the people to repent of their sin, but they refused to do so. This event stood as a lesson to the people that true worship is never about objects, but always about a heart bowed before the Lord. Let us be careful never to value anything made with hands more than we value the humble worship of our God.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Jeremiah 52:31-34

"Thirty-six years after Jehoiachin was captured,
Nebuchadnezzar's son Evil-merodach became king of
Babylon and released Jehoiachin from prison. Although
Jehoiachin had to remain in Babylon, he was given a higher
seat, a more prominent place, than all the other kings Babylon
had captured (Jer. 52:31–34). This is not an incidental detail
but rather a hopeful sign that David's throne had not been
forgotten. The King of Judah would be exalted once more,
which could only mean that God would indeed restore His
people," (Ligonier.org).
