MONDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 13:1-23

Ezekiel 13 is an utterly devastating condemnation of false prophets. "I am against you" declares the Lord. When someone claims to speak for God, it's a serious matter, and they'd better be sure that they are saying exactly what God actually wants them to say. We can do that today by ensuring that our teachers speak what is true in God's written word, the Bible. If what they say lines up with what the Bible says, we can be confident that they do speak for God. However, in a day when many people claim to speak for God who actually lie and deceive his people, we must be careful. Their judgment is certain, but let us not be led astray. May we stand near to our Bibles while we listen.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 14:1-23

Throughout the book of Ezekiel, we have seen the sins and idolatry of the people recounted and the consequences clearly explained. In today's reading, we see that even the leaders of Israel had thoroughly corrupted themselves by "taking idols into their hearts" (v. 3). Here we see the true problem with idolatry—it has never been about an object but has always been about the affections of the heart. Whatever we love the most, that is our god. Spend some time in prayer today asking God to grow your love for Him in light of His love for you (1 John 4:19).

<u>Wednesday</u> <u>Friday</u>

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 15:1-8

In today's passage, the burning of the fruitless vine is used to symbolize judgment. Fruit, produced in these vines were sour and worthless. God had set Israel apart to bear fruit. God's people show their value in their fruitfulness. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to bear fruit that gives honor and glory to Him and Him alone.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 16:1-58

Oh, how easily we think that we are doing well. Reading Ezekiel 16, some people would hardly believe such language could be found in the Bible! It is a graphic description, and it is meant to be an illustration, to teach a lesson: God is faithful though humanity is so faithless. May we see in Ezekiel 16 a picture of our redemption, and may we be reminded of the sinfulness of our hearts, and may we see the patience and grace of our God in the ways he deals with us, and may we be humbled before our gracious God and in awe of his kindness to us in spite of ourselves.

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 16:59-63

There are countless reasons for which to praise the Lord. Today, as we read this passage, let us remember that truth that even when we are not faithful to God, He is always faithful to us. It is not possible for God to be faithless (2 Tim. 2:13). What good news it is that God's character and actions are not dependent upon us, but only upon Himself. Today, and always, praise God for His faithfulness!

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 17:1-24

This chapter, written in a kind of fable, is meant to illustrate both the current and imminent state of Judah. In particular, the political state and ultimately the future under God. At the end of the chapter, we see that the parable is used to show an ideal messianic future. The terms presented assert God's sovereignty, which is seen clearly in verse 24, "I am the Lord, I have spoken, and I will do it." It can be easy for us to forget that God is sovereign over everything. Our faith is not in a god who is right some of the time or is sovereign over certain things only. Our God, the God of the Bible, is sovereign over everything, all the time, He always has been, and He always will be.
