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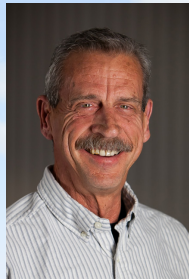

MONDAY

Prophet Project: Lamentations 1:1-22

The book of Lamentations describes the aftermath of the Babylonian invasion of Jerusalem. It is written, most scholars agree, by Jeremiah, as he appears to sit in the ashes of the fallen city of Jerusalem. Lamentations is a lament. It is written from a place of grief. Great sin has brought about terrible consequences, and lament is an appropriate response. We ought to consider what place there is in our walk with Christ for true lament over sin. Have you been broken before the Lord for your sin? Have you cried out to him for forgiveness? Have you seen the agony that your sin causes others and felt genuine remorse? In our haste to run towards grace, we can forget that taking the time to lament over our sin is good for our soul.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Lamentations 2:1-22

In this chapter of Lamentations, we are shown the complete totality of God's judgment of Jerusalem. We see the effects of God's punishment, the grieving of losses and counsel to cry out to God, and the asking of God to see what Jerusalem has suffered and to act on their behalf. God is sovereign over all these circumstances as He is in our lives. In whatever circumstances we might find ourselves in, or trials we may face, we must always remember and trust in the sovereignty of God through them all.

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Lamentations 3:1-66

“The Lord is good to those who wait for him, to the soul who seeks him,” (Lam 3:25). For those who wait for the Lord, meaning those who are faithful in serving God, not listless, passive sitting, are those who seek Him. To seek God is to desire to know Him and to do His will. God’s goodness in God’s gracious sovereignty, is the core of His character. Pray and ask the Lord to give you a heart that seeks to serve Him, to seek to do His will, knowing that He is good and gracious and praise Him for those things.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Lamentations 4:1-22

Consequences for sin can be horrible. As we read passages like Lamentations 4, it ought to strike a reverent fear into our hearts as we consider God’s loath and hatred for sin. As we see in our hearts daily a kind of rebel-lion that runs parallel with the stories we read of Israel, it ought to humble us in great measure as we consider our unworthiness to be near to God. And yet, we know that Christ stood in our place, condemned for our sins so that we might stand before God holy and blameless with great joy. May all of our brokenness over sin lead us to joy in the gospel and may all of our joy in the gospel come as rays of sun after the gloom of lament over our sin.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Lamentations 5:1-22

In verse 21, of this passage, the people are calling on the Lord to restore them to Himself. For anyone to be restored to God requires a right relationship with Him, and only God can do the restoring. For a person living today to have a restored relationship to God requires faith and trust in Christ alone for the forgiveness of sin. It is God who provided the perfect sacrifice for sin, in the death of Christ on the cross, and through Christ, God restores us to Himself. If you have been restored to God, take time to praise Him for what He has done in your life and consider who you can share this with. If you have not been restored to God, seek out someone whom you know trusts in Christ, and ask them to help you understand the great truth of the gospel.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 1:1-28

“Like the appearance of the bow that is in the cloud on the day of rain, so was the appearance of the brightness all around. Such was the appearance of the likeness of the glory of the Lord. And when I saw it, I fell on my face, and I heard the voice of one speaking” (Eze 1:28). “The glory of the Lord” shines fully in the person of Jesus Christ. “For God, who said, ‘Let light shine out of darkness,’ has shone in our hearts to give the light of the knowledge of the glory of God in the face of Jesus Christ,” (2 Cor 4:6). “The glory of the Lord” is also a consistent theme in Ezekiel and should be kept in mind as you read through this book. Also, keep in mind the response: “I fell on my face.” A similar response occurred in Revelation 1:9-20 as John, when he “saw him, I fell at his feet as though dead” (v 17).
