MONDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 24:1-27

This chapter is an ugly picture of the consequences of sinful rebellion. As the Lord reveals to Ezekiel that Jerusalem has been invaded on that very day (Jerusalem would have been about 800 miles from where Ezekiel was), he is given a picture of the judgment: a pot that was once filled with choice meat and a delicious meal is now burned so badly that even the pot has been destroyed. Whatever rich blessings someone may experience, however full their pot, the judgment of God against sin can utterly ruin and destroy every good thing they have.

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 25:1-11

Today, we enter a new section of the book of Ezekiel. From chapters 25–32, the Lord pronounces judgment upon the nations surrounding Israel. As you read through this section, notice that the purpose of God was not simply to destroy sinners, but to teach them that He is the true God (vv. 5, 7, 11). Even in judgment we see the amazing grace and mercy of our God.



Wednesday

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 25:12-17

The prophecy against Philistia came as a result of their consistent oppression, vengefulness, and enmity against Israel. They had constantly harassed Israel until David's reign. Verse 17 states, "They will know that I am the Lord, when I lay my vengeance upon them." Consider this for a moment. To be against God's people is to be against God. For those against God His vengeance will come upon them. The matter is more serious than we can truly understand. Praise God that as a believer in Christ you will no longer have to face God's vengeance.

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 27:1-36

FRIDAY

As you read today's description of the nation of Tyre, notice the wealth and prosperity they experienced but how it all came crashing down under the Lord's judgment. No doubt they were very proud of all their accomplishments, but the Bible is clear that "the Lord opposes the proud" (1 Peter 5:5). Tyre was judged and humbled for their pride. Let us take care to humble ourselves, so that the Lord won't have to.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 26:1-21

The ongoing descriptions and prophecies regarding the judgment of God on the nations ought to bring several realizations to mind for the Christian. First, when we realize that these prophecies were historically fulfilled in reality (l.e., Tyre being scraped off into the sea), we are reminded that God is always faithful to do what He says. Second, we see vivid pictures of God's holy hatred for sin, and we ought to be humbled to think that we too are sinful. Third, wee see how great a penalty Christ paid on the cross to forgive our sin. We see the wrath against our sin that he endured, and we ought to be filled with a deep sense of gratitude and a heart of worship.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 28:1-19

In this passage we see that the king of Tyre claimed deity (v. 2). In concluding the passage, we know that "All who know you among the peoples are appalled at you; you have come to a dreadful end and shall be no more forever," (v. 19). One might easily think, "who would do such a thing, who would truly claim to have deity, to be a god?" Sin causes people to think and do incredible and outlandish things. Remember Jeremiah 17:9, "The heart is deceitful above all things, and desperately sick; who can understand it?" Consider your life before Christ. Did sin cause you to do appalling things? What else might you have done if you had continued that path? Praise God that in Christ you do not have to truly consider such things. Instead you can rejoice that sin no longer has dominion over you, because you are no longer under the law, but under grace, (Romans 6:14).
