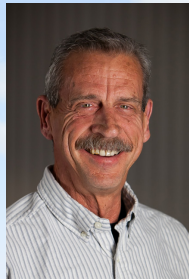

TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 19:1-14

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 20:1-49

“I will bring you out from the peoples and gather you out of the countries where you are scattered, with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm, and with wrath poured out,” (Ezekiel 20:34). After the people have been saved and have repented, God will, someday, rule over Israel in the kingdom of Messiah. This time is not known to us, but what is known is that we are to proclaim Christ, the Messiah, until that time does come. Preaching the gospel, making disciples, of all nations (Matthew 28:16-20) is the Great Commission, it is our Great Commission. Pray and ask the Lord to give you the courage and boldness to proclaim the good news of Jesus Christ.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 22:1-31

When one knows the living God their life is changed. Being brought into a relationship with the Lord makes an impact on someone that is observed in the way they live their life, and it is a tragedy when that is not evident. Throughout this chapter of our reading, it is clear that their covenant relationship with the Lord was no longer seen in the way the people of Israel were living their lives. In other words, their lips may have said that they knew God, but their lives preached an entirely different message. Let us be careful that we do not fall into the same trap.

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 21:1-32

The drawn sword is a metaphor for God's destroying agent. Verses 8-17 gives us details of the sword and that is it hones to razor sharpness, to describe its lethal effects. The focus here is God's judgment and it is not to be taken lightly. God will judge and those not in Christ will face the wrath of God. Surely you can think of many, who you care for, that you don't want to see facing the wrath of God. Pray and ask for opportunities to evangelize the lost.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 23:1-49

In a way to show the significance, of the sin committed by Israel and Judah, this chapter describes them as two sisters. As you read through this chapter note, the descriptors used to describe each "sister." See how Oholibah became more corrupt than her sister, Oholah. Sin is corrupt and corrosive. Nations become corrupt because the individual is corrupt because of sin. Seek to constantly be on guard against the temptation to sin. When you do sin be diligent in asking the Lord to forgive and to repent. Make every effort to give no opportunity to the flesh and to put on Christ (Romans 13:14).
