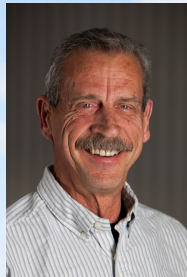

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 44:1-31

We try to avoid falling. If we do happen to fall, we do everything we can to protect our faces. We put out our arms. We roll. We do whatever it takes to protect our face. Chapter 44 of Ezekiel is filled with vivid descriptions of the temple, from which much could be said. For today's devotional, just focus in on verse 4. Read it. Ezekiel 44:4, I looked, and behold, the glory of the LORD filled the temple of the LORD. And I fell on my face." Meditate on that verse for a few moments and imagine what it would be like to behold the glory of the Lord in the temple. Ezekiel's response is fitting. He falls on his face in humble adoration, respect, and perhaps fear. Anytime in scripture, someone encounters God, the response is similar. Falling on faces is a pattern when people meet God. 

WEDNESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 46:1-24

The “prince” is mentioned, in this passage several times, in regards to sacrifices. The prince is meant to be an example to the people of spiritual maturity. Christ is the ultimate example of spiritual maturity and Whom we are to emulate. Lord also uses the people around us as examples to follow as they follow Christ. Pray that the Lord places spiritually mature people in your life, who seek after Christ to be like Christ so that you would also grow to be more like Christ.

FRIDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 47:13-48:35

As we come to the end of the book of Ezekiel, we read about the division of the land in God’s future kingdom. It can be tempting to get lost in the details, but notice how the book finishes: “And the name of the city from that time on shall be, ‘The LORD Is There.’” We may not understand all the details of the glorious future we have in Christ, but we know the overall point is that God will be with us, and we will be with Him. What a day that will be!

THURSDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 47:1-12

While heaven will be a lot more likely earth than the typical nebulous vision we have of floating in clouds, in the final kingdom, the new heavens, and the new earth, there will be amazing differences than what we currently find on earth. Chapter 47 of Ezekiel’s vision deal with many of those changes that relate to water. The picture in verses 1-12 describe freshwater flowing from the temple outward, bringing life and vitality and health and re-freshment to the plants and animals of creation, and in turn, to all of the people who live there. The new heavens and new earth will be a place of remarkable joy and wonder, and reading passages like this ought to stimulate our hearts to long for eternity all the more.

SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 1:1-21

“But Daniel resolved that he would not defile himself with the king’s food, or with the wine that he drank. Therefore he asked the chief of the eunuchs to allow him not to defile himself” (Dan 1:8). Daniel resolved not to defile himself with food and drink that had been devoted to idols. Daniel did not want to compromise himself and be untrue to his commitment to God. Daniel was resolved, he had made up his mind, that he would not do such things. We too are to be resolved in our commitment to God. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to be resolved in your commitment to Him.
