#### MONDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 5:1-12

The Scriptures continually attest to the danger of pride. In today's reading, King Belshazzar was throwing a wild party, and the more he drank, the more his pride was inflated. As the Lord watched the situation, He determined to bring the king to his knees in fear by handwriting a message on the wall. While we likely won't ever experience such a phenomenon, the lesson for us is the same. Only the Lord is God, and we must always strive to stay humble because we are prone to the exact same temptation of self-exaltation. Ask the Lord today to help you identify blind spots in your life where pride reigns and for the grace to humble yourself.

### TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 5:13-31

As Daniel interprets the handwriting, as he alone is able to, it is a message from the one true God. It is a message of judgment that tells of the end of the Babylonian Empire. The Old Testament is not the only place where we read of God's judgment. Judgment or judge is used over one hundred times in the New Testament. God's judgment ought to be taken seriously. Yet for those who have believed in Christ, there is rejoicing. "Truly, truly, I say to you, whoever hears my word and believes him who sent me has eternal life. He does not come into judgment, but has passed from death to life" (John 5:24).

Wednesday

Prophet Project: Daniel 6:1-28

This chapter contains, one of the more well known biblical accounts, Daniel and the Lion's den. Daniel had refused, to treat the Persian king as the god's chief representative, Daniel refused to obey the injunction signed by Darius. After being placed in the lion's den, God delivered Daniel, and Darius acknowledged the power of Daniel's God. Daniel was delivered from the lion's den because his trust was in God and was found to be blameless before him. We too are to trust in God and seek to be blameless before Him. Pray and ask the Lord to help you to live a life that is honoring and glorifying to Him.

Prophet Project: Daniel 7:13-28

FRIDAY

As we read biblical prophecy, we can be tempted toward fear. There is no doubt that the events described in today's reading are difficult to consider. As Daniel's vision is interpreted, we are faced with the reality that the fourth beast, the Antichrist, will one day prevail over the saints (v. 21). That is, until Jesus, the Ancient of Days, comes. This is the key to conquering our fear; to remember Jesus and His coming. There is no doubt that we will have suffering and sorrow in this life, but Jesus is coming!

### **THURSDAY**

Prophet Project: Daniel 7:1-12

Beginning with today's passage we read of Daniel's visions which have been described as apocalyptic visions. These visions were a reassurance to God's people that, in spite of exile and persecution, God is in control, that God has His purposes, and He will see them through. We too know that God has His purposes and that He is in control. You might not always understand or can see every detail, but as you read Scripture and see His faithfulness, ask the Lord to grow your faith in Him.

### SATURDAY

Prophet Project: Daniel 8:1-14

In Daniel's vision, of the ram and the goat, we read of him prophesizing about historical figures long before any of them were born. Looking back we can now see that the ram represents the Medo-Persian Empire, with the higher horn representing the stronger, Persian part. The "male goat," which "came from the west across the face of the whole earth," (v. 5) represents Alexander the Great who came from Greece, which was to the west. Daniel prophesied about events that took place that we can read about in history books. It truly is a blessing that we can read about a prophesy and also read about its fulfillment.
