MONDAY

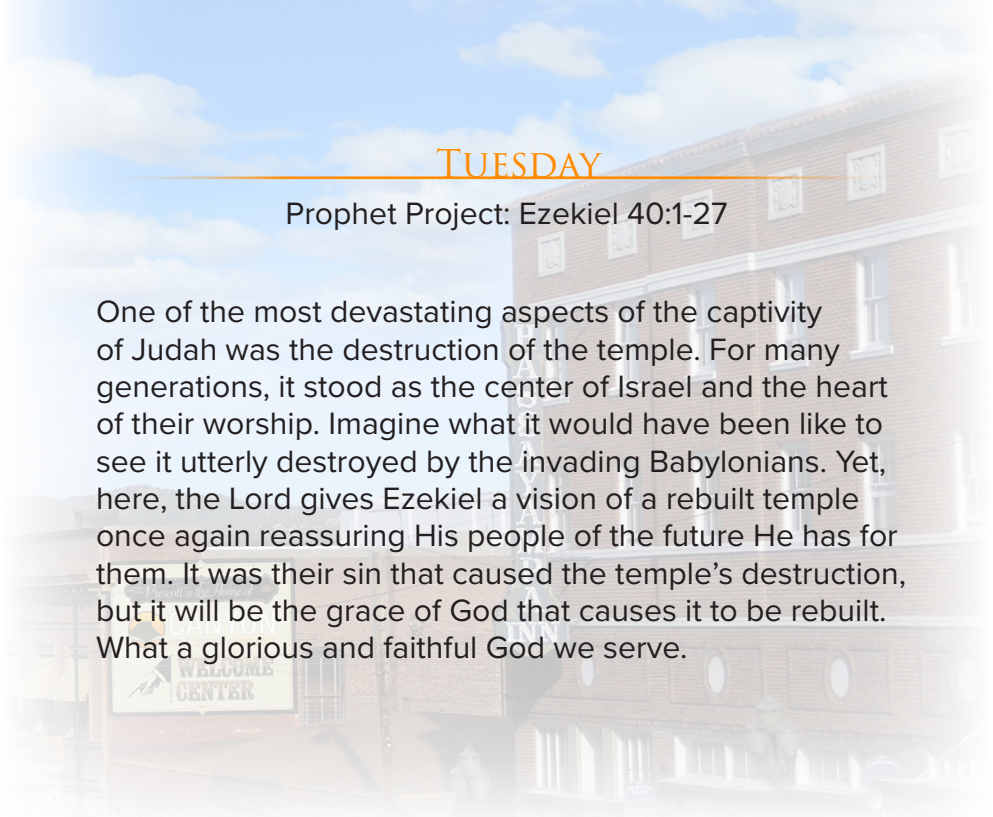
Prophet Project: Ezekiel 38:1-39:29

Chapters 38 and 39 of Ezekiel are one large unit of thought to be read together. While there has been much debate and confusion over the years, it is clear that this is a prophecy intent on making one point and Ezekiel 39:7–8 makes the point clear. The goal of all of this is that everyone would recognize the LORD as God: “And my holy name I will make known in the midst of my people Israel, and I will not let my holy name be profaned anymore. And the nations shall know that I am the LORD, the Holy One in Israel. Behold, it is coming, and it will be brought about, declares the Lord GOD. That is the day of which I have spoken.” Whatever details you may get lost in, always find your way back to the main idea: God will prevail and show Himself to be the Lord overall.

## TUESDAY

Prophet Project: Ezekiel 40:1-27

One of the most devastating aspects of the captivity of Judah was the destruction of the temple. For many generations, it stood as the center of Israel and the heart of their worship. Imagine what it would have been like to see it utterly destroyed by the invading Babylonians. Yet, here, the Lord gives Ezekiel a vision of a rebuilt temple once again reassuring His people of the future He has for them. It was their sin that caused the temple's destruction, but it will be the grace of God that causes it to be rebuilt. What a glorious and faithful God we serve.





## WEDNESDAY

### Prophet Project: Ezekiel 40:28-49

As described in the temple plan, there is a chamber for “priests who have charge of the temple” (v. 45) and a chamber for the Zadokite priests (v. 46). The Zadokite priests, called “the sons of Zadok,” were a Levitical family descended from Levi. Zadok’s sons served as priests because of their faithfulness to David and Solomon. Not all priests are faithful because priests, no matter how devoted they are, are still men. That is why we praise God for Jesus the Great High Priest (Hebrews 4:14-16).

## FRIDAY

### Prophet Project: Ezekiel 42:1-20

As the description of the new temple comes to a close, it’s outer wall is measured and the Lord makes clear that it is “to make a separation between the holy and the common (v. 20).” All throughout the Bible this theme runs through—the Lord is holy and cannot compromise His holiness. In the same way, He calls His people to holiness as representatives of Him. In light of His character and His redemption, let us strive to be faithful in this call.

## THURSDAY

### Prophet Project: Ezekiel 41:1-26

The “Most Holy Place” (v. 4), the place where, on the day of atonement, only the high priest entered annually. How are we then to enter the Most Holy Place? Through the full assurance of faith in Jesus Christ. Read Hebrews 10:19-25 and meditate on the passage. Pray and thank the Lord that through Christ, we can have a full assurance of faith.

## SATURDAY

### Prophet Project: Ezekiel 43:1-27

The burnt offerings that were to have been made, as described in this passage, were all symbolic of death for sin. The sacrificial offerings were provided to ensure continuing communion with God. The offerings did not take away sin. This can only happen through the perfect sacrifice of Christ. “You know that he appeared in order to take away sins, and in him there is no sin,” (1 John 3:5). It is through Christ that the Christian has a continual communion with God that can never be broken. The Christian knows that the Lord will never leave or forsake them (Hebrews 13:5).
